### Explanation:

The red lines indicate the lines I actually surveyed on the ground. I identified the S.E. cor of sur. no 1223. G. W. T. & P. R.R. Co. a stone mound - one with  $\bar{x}$  and one "Oct. - 19 - 88 - K. X." underneath. I found a black bottle inside of which I found a paper rolled around a small stick. The paper was so fragile I did not unroll only enough to read the names of some of the parties who are named in the field notes describing this cor.

At the S.E. cor of sur no 36. Blk. 2. T & N.O. R.R. Co I found stone mound - from which a cedar with  $\bar{x}$  bears N 67 1/2 W 36. vs. a do. with  $\bar{x}$  S 72 1/2 W 36. both standing and plainly marked

At the S.E. cor of sur no. 12. Same block. I found large flat rock lying on ground. with N.W. 941 - 97 from which I found mes. with  $\bar{x}$  bears N 9 1/2 E 100. vs.

At the N.E. cor of 1237. D & S. E. R.R. Co. I found a large stone mound. 801 across N 1/2 E and 428. vs West of the point I made for the N.W. cor of sur no. 50. in line prolonged N 1/2 E. from the S.E. cor of sur no. 12. T & N.O. Blk. 2.
