Beginning at the North West corner of the David Chandler survey at a stake for corner from which a Post Oak 10 in dia. brs. N.85 E. 10 vrs. and a Magnolia 11 in dia. brs. S. 80 W. 3 vrs. (Both bearings of the above corner are still standing and are plainly marked. At a former time I resurveyed the entire survey of the David Chandler and know this is the Northwest corner of the said David Chandler.)

Thence West at 692 vrs. Village Slough 50 vrs. North of Pine Island Bayou at 737 vrs. the West bank of Village Slough and at 1584-1/2 the West boundry line of the D. Choat Survey of 1/4 League 1375 vrs. North of its South West corner.

(I located the West line of the D. Choat by beginning a survey at the resurvey corner for the South West corner of the Mary Ann Cottle survey of 1 Labor of land a stake for this corner from which a Sweet Gum 36 in dia. brs. N. 16 W. 7 vrs. and an Iron wood S. 43 E. 1-1/2 vrs. and a Pin Oak S. 45 W. 2 vrs. all marked \overline{X}

I think the true corner of the Mary Ann Cottle should be S. 49 E. of this point from which a Pecan would bear S. 15 E. 4 vrs. and a Sweet Gum 36 in dia. brs. N. 55 W. 7 vrs.

From the first described corner I ran E. 120 vrs.

Thence N. 40 vrs. Thence E. 100 vrs. Thence N. 49 E. 25-1/2 vrs. to the Southwest corner of the D.Choat 1/4 League survey, and for this corner I found a stakefrom which two dead and fallen Pin Oaks which bears N. 49 E. 4 vrs. and S. 32 E. 5-6/10 vrs. Thence N. 1220 vrs. crossing the G.B.& K.C.R.R. Track and at 1375 vrs. the intersection of my line running West. In running North of the David Choat West boundry line I found an old marked line.)

Thence North 103 vrs.

Thence West 163 vrs. G.B. & K.C.R.R. Track 200 vrs. West line of Mary
Ann Cottle 212-1/2 vrs. Resurvey West line for same survey, and at 367
vrs. S. & E.T.R.R. track and at 400 vrs. I againman South 53 vrs. to
the marked line for the Uriah Davidson South line, by resurvey.
Thence West 560 vrs. Pine Island Bayou. (Here I noticed that the resurvey line for the Davidson South line was 20 vrs. South of me at this point.

Thence North 53 varas. Thence West 101-1/2 vrs. Boggy Creek 37 vrs.

North of where the same enters into Pine Island Bayou. And at 142-1/2

vrs. the West Bank of Boggy Creek, and at 1773 vrs. the West line of the John Choat and the E. line of the Little Ed Choat and at 2865 vrs.

the East line of another Ed Choat.




