Mr. G. G. Foster, County Surveyor, Canyon, Texas. Dear Sir:-

On day before yesterday I sent to you by Wells-Fargo Express a package containing the three sets offield notes covering a resurvey of Block 1, TT Ry. Co. in Randall county made by you sometime ago, and with the papers I intended to send you advice concerning some corrections to be made in the same and to advise what is further necessary to be done in order to get the papers in proper shape upon your records and in this department.

I numbered the three packages of field The three sets notes Numbers 1, 2 and 3. are simply field notes of surveys made in that block. Now, you will note that in the certificate to none of the field notes do you certify as county surveyor of Randall county, and in the field notes marked 1 and 2, you do not give the book and page of record. Now, I suppose you intend to make the field notes in package No. 1 a part of your records by incorporating them in a bound volume. If that is the case, after properly inserting the county in your certificate, you should have the said field notes bound and given a volume number and let the numbers I have placed in the upper righthand corner of the field notes serve the purpose of page numbers. The same corrections should be made in the field notes in package No. 2 and No. 3 as to your official capacity in the certificate. That is to say, your certificate should show this work was done by you as county surveyor of Randall county. The certificate in these latter two field notes in Books 2 and 3 should also show that they are of record in Volumes _____, page _____ of the

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General Land Office.

> records of your office, and in inserting the volume and page, kindly use the volume number which you may give your package No. 2 after it is bound and the pages of the field notes in that volume.

Now, when you have properly corrected the field notes in Packages 2 and 3, you may return them to this department and keep the other set which is to be bound by you as a record of your office. When the Packages 2 and 3 are returned to this department, the field notes contained in package No. 2 will be filed in this office, each sheet being filed in its respective file. Of course they will be examined to see if they are correct, and the field notes for package No. 3 will be returned to you by this department without any charge. Upon the reverse of the field notes for package No. 3 we will incorporate a statement showing that they are duplicates of field notes which have been filed in this office and upon which the acreage in the survey has been corrected upon the abstracts in this department. With this third package, when it is returned to you, you can do as you see fit. I suppose you intend to turn them over to the owners of the surveys in this block. The statement made, or rather to be incorporated on the reverse will show the owners that the corrected survey made by you has been accepted in this office.

The difficulty in your field notes, it seems, is you have adopted a form which was used by a state surveyor in preparing field notes of a resurvey. I have heretofore advised why I cannot consistently and in accordance with the statute attach my certificate of approval of the field notes as made by you.

You need not undertake to make out the statement on the reverse of the field notes above mentioned as that can be done in this department, and I might possibly not word the statement identically as you might copy it.
