I Tom C. Davis County Surveyor of Shelby County do  
certify that this Map shows the correct position of the said  
G. H. Patterson 24 Labors and the connection therewith of  
conflicting surveys. I have carefully measured all  
lines (finding the original marks thereon) of which  
the courses and distances are stated on this Map,  
and said Courses and distances are as found  
same to be on the ground excepting such immat-  
erial changes as were necessary to be made in  
callancing the work. The map of Shelby County as prepared at the General  
Land Office shows the prob. Claim 309 acres survey as being in conflict with  
the Patterson survey, but although I made long search I could not find corners evidenced by upright trees, as  
called for in the field notes of the said Davis survey. Therefore I do not show said Davis survey on this map, but it  
is possible it may be in conflict. The Lewis Bass 16 acres is now invalid, being a forfeited preemption survey.

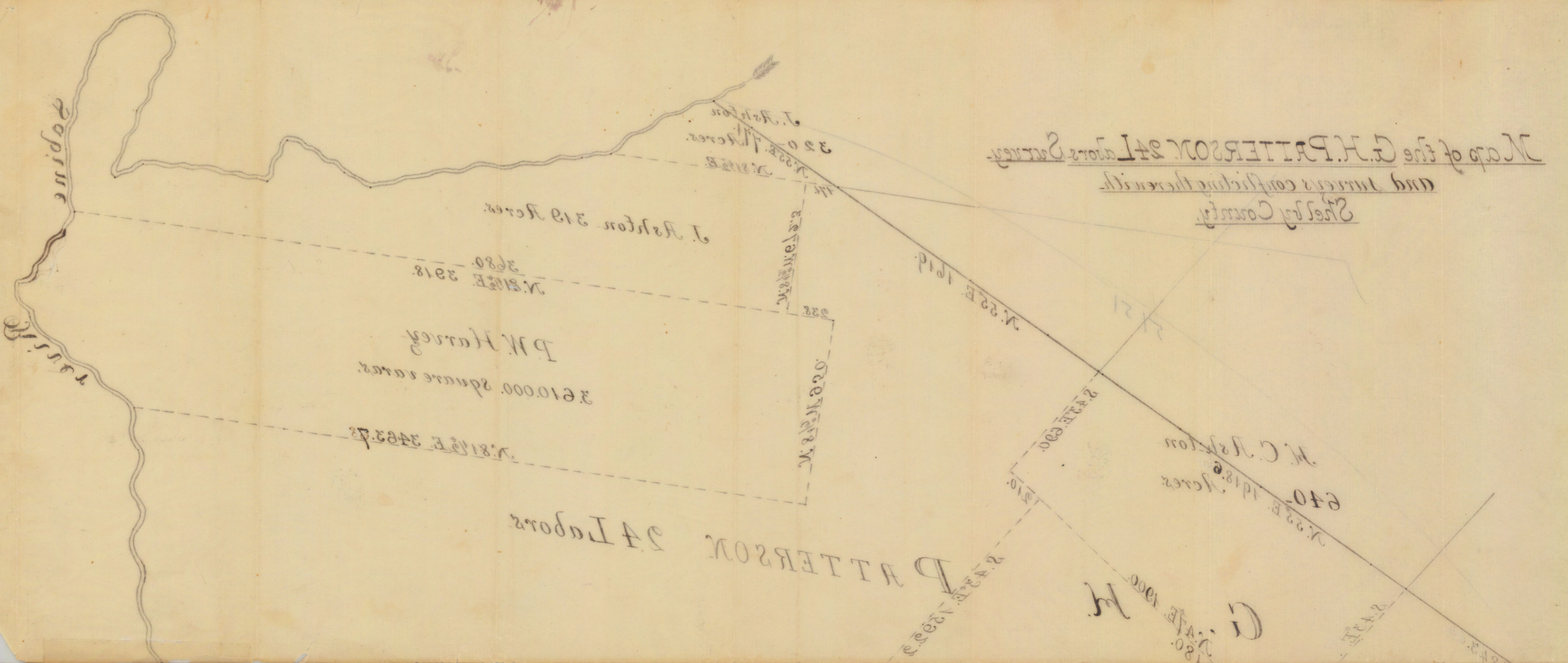
