The enclosed map of Survey No 2 Block
4 I'm G. W. R. of Hays County with the accompanying
copy of field notes of recent Survey of said
Survey No Two, and adjoining Survey I submit
which as proposed in my previous letter

To verify the S. W. corner of Survey No One
which is the original and initial point of Survey
No Two. I commenced at the S. W. Cor. of Sec'ty
N. Survey No 8 Block D and run the connecting ^{line}
called for in the Original Notes of Survey No One.

There is an excess of westing on this line of sixty
vars., and in Davis in Northings of 46 v.^s. This excess
in westing, may be due to uneven careful chaining
in the measurement of said line.

After identifying the S. E. corner of No One
by measurement and bearing, one of which was to the
Cimarron hill East of San Saba, which bears $S 32^{\circ} 40' E$
I ran the South line of Survey No One.

By running due west from said corner of Survey
No One $19^{\circ} 28. \frac{1}{2}$ vars. I find the S. W. corner of one
from the Person's bearing tree to be $34^{\circ} 0' N$ of
of said corner. I then went to the person's bush,
or tree, and run due East $22^{\circ} 0' S$ and found a
stake (no mound) There is an excess of $28. \frac{1}{2}$
vars on this line, determined from said bearing
tree. Said person's is 6" in diameter for 2 feet above
the ground, with a bushy top, (a large part cut away)

The corner from the S. E. cor No One to S. W. cor No
One Should be $W 89^{\circ} 18'$ instead of due west

This corner run with $Q^{o} 45^{\circ}$ variation. As there can be no question, or doubt about these two corners.

I then went to the North East corner of Survey No. 162, a stone mound, the original corner of the St. Canutes Survey, better known as Harley's Corner, which has been known and recognized as such. Beginning at said stone mound, there $N 45^{\circ} E$ at 167' 0" cross Q.M.R.R., at 600. 0" pass a stone mound, a Subdivision corner, at 711 a stone mound, corner of Harley Subdivision, at 985' 0" the N.W. cor. of Survey No. 162 East end,

Then $S 45^{\circ} W$ 150' 0" to a mound, the N.E. corner of Survey No. 163, Hancock Valley. This corner appears within two (2) 0' of the corner set by G. W. Marshall in March 1884. Established from the North west corner of Survey 163. D. Brooks, Surveyor.

After determining the S.E. corner of 163 in the manner stated, I then returned to the S.W. corner of Survey No. 640, and ran due South ^{839. 00}, intersecting the East line of Survey 163, 305. 0" $N 45^{\circ} W$ from the N.E. cor. of said Survey.

The original mules of Survey 162 made this intersection $7. 0" N 45^{\circ} E$ from the East corner of Survey 163. This line I corrected to said point, to correspond with original mules.

I then went to the S.W. cor. of the S. Brooks Survey No. 184, a stone mound, set by J. Loring. There is also a stone mound, 55' 0" $S 45^{\circ} W$ set by J. S. Englund, for same corner, on the East line of the old Mitchell Survey.

Beginning at said stone mound set by J. Loring, for the S.W. corner cor. of Survey 184, on the

East line of the James Mitchell Survey N^o 183

From N^o 145^W 460^E cross San Felipe Creek, at 652.^E cross G.H. & A. R.R. at 982^E or a stone mound the South East corner of the John Kinke Survey N^o 161. 3/4, a stone mound at 1929. 0^E another stone mound, the North East cor of the Kinke Survey N^o 161. 3/4 at 2581. 0^E an old stone mound. The W. W. cor of Survey 184 in the East line of Survey N^o 2, at 2879. 0^E a stone mound set for the North East cor. of Survey N^o 2

From South 11. 0^E a stone. Hence West 574. 7/2^E to the East line of Survey N^o One, a stone 1142 values North from the S.E. cor of Survey No One, in Hence South 1142 or to a large earth mound the original South East cor of said Survey No One, this line being 191 0^E short of measured in original note.

I then commenced at the stone mound, the N.E. cor of Survey N^o 161. 3/4 Hence S 45° W 950 0^E a stone mound, the W. W. cor of said Kinke Survey. Hence S 45° E 717. 2^E or to a stone mound the North cor of the Martin 1/2 acre Survey. Continued hence Corso 947. 0^E a stone mound on the North line of the James Mitchell Survey N^o 183. and the S. W. cor of the Kinke Survey N^o 161. 3/4 this corner set by Dr. James Farmer County Surveyor Kinney Co.

This begins at said stone mound set for the North cor of the Martin Survey. on the east line of Survey 161. 3/4, Hence S 45° W 11154. 0^E to the W. W. cor of said Martin Survey on the East line of John Kinke Survey 161. 1/2 a stone

Mound set by Mr. Jones & County Surveyor.

17 I then commenced at the N.W. cor. of the Corusco
 18 Survey, an old stone mound. on the East line of
 19 Survey No 2. referred to in above note. Thence
 20 N 45° E 2145. 0^s an old stone mound. The trees
 21 being both cut down within the past 12 months

22 Mr. Jones formerly County Surveyor. found this
 23 corner, and the trees called for in the original
 24 notes, when Mr. Jones found this corner. he had
 25 Mr. Perry. T.C. Gremillion & Farley examine said
 26 trees. & subsequently showed said corner bearing
 27 his to Frank Dignowity, who proposed to lo-
 28 cate the excess of 90. 0^s between the Corusco
 29 Survey 164. and the Jas Mitchell Reinde and
 30 Jas G. W Survey No 2. Mr. Jones declined,
 31 and stated there was no vacancy, but an excess

in the Comiso Survey of 90 acres

It fully authorizes me to make this
Statement, and will make an affidavit to
the same. In March 1884. W. L. N. Marshall
in making a Survey found these bearing
trees, both of them are now gone, but the
stumps remain.

If you desire any more information
to establish the fact, ^{that} there is no vacancy, on
any of the lines of Survey No 2, which call
for all the adjoining Survey's. I am ready
to furnish any information required which
can be obtained on the front. I have stated
there is an excess in measurement on several
lines, and a deficiency in others.

My surveys have been confined to the original
land marks, where the same could be
obtained, and to Corro and distance in other
cases, great care has been taken in running
adjoining Survey's. All the work has been done
with a transit instrument. Excepting the Cemetery
line from Survey No 8 to S. E. cor of No 2, and
was run with a compass, all of which is
respectfully submitted for your consideration.
