Dear Sir:

In regard to the investigations on the S. L. Scott Survey in Archer County, we beg to advise you as follows:

In November and December of 1908 and in May and September of 1910, Mr. Brookes Baker, a surveyor, of Fort Worth, Texas, in conjunction with a survey of a large area in Archer County, made a sub-division of the Wm. Ainsworth and Wm. S. Blount Surveys located just west of the Falls County School Land in that county. The notes showing lines run, corners found, and corners set in making this sub-division are now a part of the records of this office. We have prepared a map showing some of these investigations made and lines determined.

Mr. Baker began at the northwest corner of the John M. Taylor Survey #24, marked by a northwest fence corner, from which an old mesquite stump bears N 30 W 64 vs. He ran thence South 950 vs; thence West 949 vs to the northwest corner of John M. Taylor #25, marked by a mound of stone sunk in the ground; thence West 2075 vs. to the northwest corner of the Allison Aarons Survey, an old stone marked X where the road from the east turns south; thence South at 1985 vs. set a stone marked "N.E.B." for the northeast corner of the Wm. S. Blount Survey, 3694 vs. east of a stone marked "N.W.B." for the northwest corner of the Blount Survey, a total distance south of 3860 vs. and set a stone marked "S.E.B." for the southwest corner of the Aarons Survey and the southeast corner of the Blount Survey; thence West 11 vs. to the northeast corner of the Wm. Ainsworth Survey; thence South, at 2999 vs. the southeast corner of the Wm. Ainsworth Survey, and continued south, there being a fence along the line, at 4255 vs. passed the southwest corner of the fence; in all 4320 vs. to a large rock 5 vs. north of an east and west fence. From a stone marked "S.W.A." for the southwest corner of the Ainsworth Survey he ran east, at 1277 vs. cross south fork of Little Wichita, at

1357 vs. cross same and at 1477 vs. cross same again, in all
5278 vs. to the southeast corner of said Wm. Ainsworth
Survey which had been located as described above.

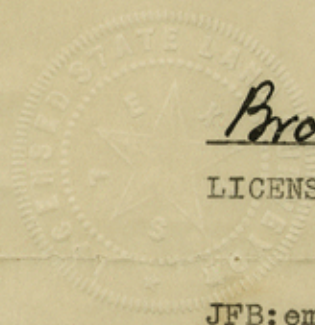
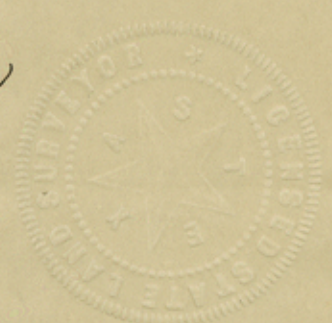
