

For the location of the lands for the H. & C. R. W. Co
in Austin County, the true limits of the several lands upon
which these locations have been made has to be properly designated
as the dates for the same in hand were very insufficient, and
apparently in contradiction amongst another.

After a careful examination of the dates we found,
that the first step to be taken in this matter was to ascertain
the true position or location of the Saw Felipe Town Tract with
the Vital Flores League & Labor and the H. & C. R. W. Co's League.

The beginning point of the Saw Felipe Town Tract can
be ascertained by a Rock, though the bearing trees are washed away.
The N.W. line of said tract is for several miles well marked with
stone at each mile. This N.W. line running S. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ W was extended
giving the Town tract its length the filee notes call for 19800
Varas, till we were N. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ W of the Mouth of the Coshatta Branch
into the Saw Bernardo, we found this whole distance S. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 26249
Varas and at the end were 1948 Varas N. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ W of said Mouth of
Coshatta Branch, showing thus clearly a deficiency in accuracy
in the Records, either not having enough space between the
Saw Felipe Town Tract and the Vital Flores League and
Labor (which has only one natural corner, that is its W corner
being at said Mouth of the Coshatta Branch) or not giving
enough land to said Vital Flores, the deficiency is 651 Varas
Further more it shows that the Records were deficient also in
the direction S. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ E, for giving the Saw Felipe Town tract
its width of 6140 Varas as it calls for and actually has between
the two S. & F. Austin's Leagues, the West corner of the Vital Flores
is either 908 Varas below the extension of the S. E. line of the Saw

of Felipe Town tract, or the said Vital Flores League on-
plus that meets with the S. of Fresn's, which is added and also
for the Vital Flores, when the Vital Flores does not call for the
Fresn's. This fact does explain a good many contradictions
existing S.E. of the San Felipe Town tract.

The E corner of the San Felipe Town tract & is
washed away, but the W corner P of the labor no 1 ~~exists~~
exists and giving the distance from P to Q the length it
calls for in 510 Varas enabled us to ascertain exactly how much
it projects N.E. over A. we found this to be 957 Varas. Therefore
the length of the S.E. line of the Town tract is not 20360 Varas
~~but 20759 Varas~~

The next to be done was to ascertain the true relative
position of the Wm. Gammel Survey to the E corner of the Vital
Flores. To effect this we meandered very carefully the mean-
derings of the San Bernabe from the mouth of the Coshatta Br.
E to the point G somewhat appears to be the E corner of the said
Wm. Gammel on San Bernabe and found the meanderings
exactly coinciding with those made for the location of the S. &
H.C.R.W Co Survey in Colorado Co, but these meanderings
differ widely with those made in Austin Co, the cause of which
difference we found, that the variation of the needle was in
Austin Co was set on the wrong side of the North line of the
Compass. The result of our examination was that a line
connecting the points F and G is N 26° 45' W 18271 Varas
long to base. We tested this by calculating the distance for
N 45° W & N 45° E. taking the N.W. line of the Vital Flores
as Base line & found to be correct 17145 Varas & 6324 Varas

After being satisfied about the proposed relation between E & G we connected E with the Gamineel S corner as given in red ink on the accompanying map

Then we tied the W Gamineel S corner with the E corner N of the Louis Von Roeder League in the manner indicated in red ink on the map noting the differences in actual length with those in the field notes, a retesting of the result was made similar to the mode of testing the relative position between E & G

In running up the Meanders of the San Bernardo from E to G we found the W. H. Strahans 320 acres situated on a different place situated than the field notes for same describe it. The plain & well marked S corner is N $\frac{1}{10}, 50\frac{1}{2}$ W 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ Twpas from & the Mouth of Chatta on the San Bernardo. The place is occupied by two different parties no other natural corners could be found except the W corner shows a tree in the neighborhood with marks on same, but could not get any dates as its bearing or distance to the road point on the accompanying Map, we gave the tract the Sigo, the field notes called for, but the h.w. line differs widely, apparently the location was part office work with insufficient dates - we found also the dates for M. Hutton's 640 acres, particularly the tree on the crossing of its N line with the San Bernardo and the N.W. corner, both points we tied to actual lines run by us as indicated on the map in red ink

For the Actual relation of the James Cummins 5 Leagues tract, to the other surveys, we had the point Ma Stone corner of the Louis Von Roeder League. Further we found

for the Klegberg Survey the East corner marked with a large
stone and in course and distance from the Road corner as
near correct as can be expected. The S.E. corner of the Cuming
5 Leagues had to be fixed and therefore by extending the line
N to W in the course of $86\frac{1}{2}$ E + ascertain where it intersects
the W line of the S. 4 Austin League, about the location
of this line there is no doubt as the line is plain and well
marked through the timber on Mill Creek where said
line crosses the creek, also the E corner of the Jones labor is
said timber is well and unmistakably defined coinciding
in distance with the field notes. The distance from the W
corner of the Jones labor to the intersection with the James
Cummings S. line we found to be 3024 Varas and the distance
from the Klegberg S. line corner to said intersection to be 8939 to

Actual Survey on the ground can not harmonize the
field note length of the S.E. line, the S.W. line + N.W. line of
said S. 4 Austin Survey. Circumstances indicate that
the S. corner B is where the N.W. line of the Law Felipe Town tract
crosses the head of the Anchoa Dale, the distance from A
coincides with the exception of a reversal of the figures 4 and 9
in the field notes. We believe candidly that the figures
in red ink on the map are the nearest to the actual truth +
as they are based upon actual and careful Survey.

For the lands S.E. of the Law Felipe Town tract
we have only the point P a well defined corner. The
point P had to be reconstructed not only from P but
also from the N.W. lines of the labor to 12, 13, 14, 17 & 18
and was satisfactory to the parties who occupied to 17 & 18

and who have the corner marked. The connecting line of the points V & U (as well defined corner) was found to be 4940 ft N 87 $\frac{1}{4}$ E & shows how the J. S. Borden Survey conflicts with the John Little Survey. The actual points U & T were found coinciding with the field notes. The small irregularities in the J. S. Borden field notes are marked in red ink on the map also those in the D. B. B. & R. R. Survey.

The Survey of the S. B. Evans can hardly agree with either reekless or insufficient dates for compilation the proper figures are marked in red ink on map.

The proper representation of the two labors for J. B. Allen and Robt. McHutt (or A. Huykendale) on the map, the dates in their field notes are insufficient not designating any natural corner which might lead to a reconstruction. The beginning corner of the Robt. McHutt is the corner of the Dalgado Survey which seems to be abandoned and the field notes for same cannot be found, neither in the County Records nor in the General Land Office said to come of the Dalgado shall be as the field notes of the McHutt State in the S. W. line of Miles Allen (not his S. corner). an old sketch in the General Land Office indicates said corner to be 280 Varas N 45 W from Miles Allen's S. corner for safety sake not to conflict with the G. & C. R. R. Co Survey bearing with these labors we represented both labors as high up as we could find dates.
