Camp on the Salado creek

In

accordance with instructions given me by Mr. John James, District Surveyor for Bexar District, I proceeded to the land to establish the limits of the two leagues of land originally deeded to Doña Maria Felicitana Duran and generally known as the tract belonging to the heirs of Osorio, and in conformity with the acts of survey as set forth in a certified translation of the deed to said land, I began at the ruins of an old stone house pointed out to me by Cesario Garmona and Clemente Mansola two old Mexican citizens of San Antonio who being questioned stated that they knew it to be the old "Rancho" and had at one time been occupied by Shepherds, Clemente Mansola having known it a long time prior to the date of said deed.

From the center of said old Rancho I run a line due south and at 2387 vs. reached the north bank of the Salado Creek, at 2405 vs. crossed said Creek, 30 vs. above an old pass in said Creek and supposed to be the "Paso del Torote", at 2500 vs. I established a corner being a Stake from which a Mesquite 8 inches in dia. $6\frac{1}{4}$ vs. dist. and a Hackberry 5 inches in dia. $5\frac{1}{2}$ vs. $9\frac{1}{2}$ vs. — This corner by measurement I ascertained to be 197 vs. North of the north bounding line of Survey N^o 93, made by Joseph A. Troy, Dep^t Surveyor in the name of Ignacio Perez.

From said corner I run due West 2500 vs. which brought me to the Southern edge of the Paso Hondo Road, a Stake and Pile of Stones for corner. This corner I found to be 83 vs. North of an old Road which runs into the Paso Hondo Road about 200 vs. to the Westward, This corner is also 197 vs. North of the North boundary line of said Survey N^o 93 — and is 955 vs. East and 1578 vs. North from the S. E. corner of the San Antonio Town Tract ascertained by actual measurement —

From this last corner I returned again to the old Rancho and began as before at the center of the same and run due North 2500 vs. and planted a Stake and raised a small Pile of Stones for a corner, and from said

Corner I found the Astillero Road to be 10 vs. to the North and 20 vs. West
 From said Corner I run due West at 20 vs. reached the Astillero Road
 at 1538 vs. reached the Eastern Margin of the Salado Creek, at 2260 vs
 reached the Carbonero Road (Camino del Carbonero) at 2500 vs. planted
 a Stake and raised a pile of Stones for the N.W. corner of the Survey,
 The Carbonero Road is 240 vs. due East and 138 vs. South from this corner
 The position of the Rancho the Old Pass and the roads above referred to
 will more fully appear by reference to the Plot on page 3 of this sheet
 The foregoing survey was made by me on the 25th & 26th of this
 month.

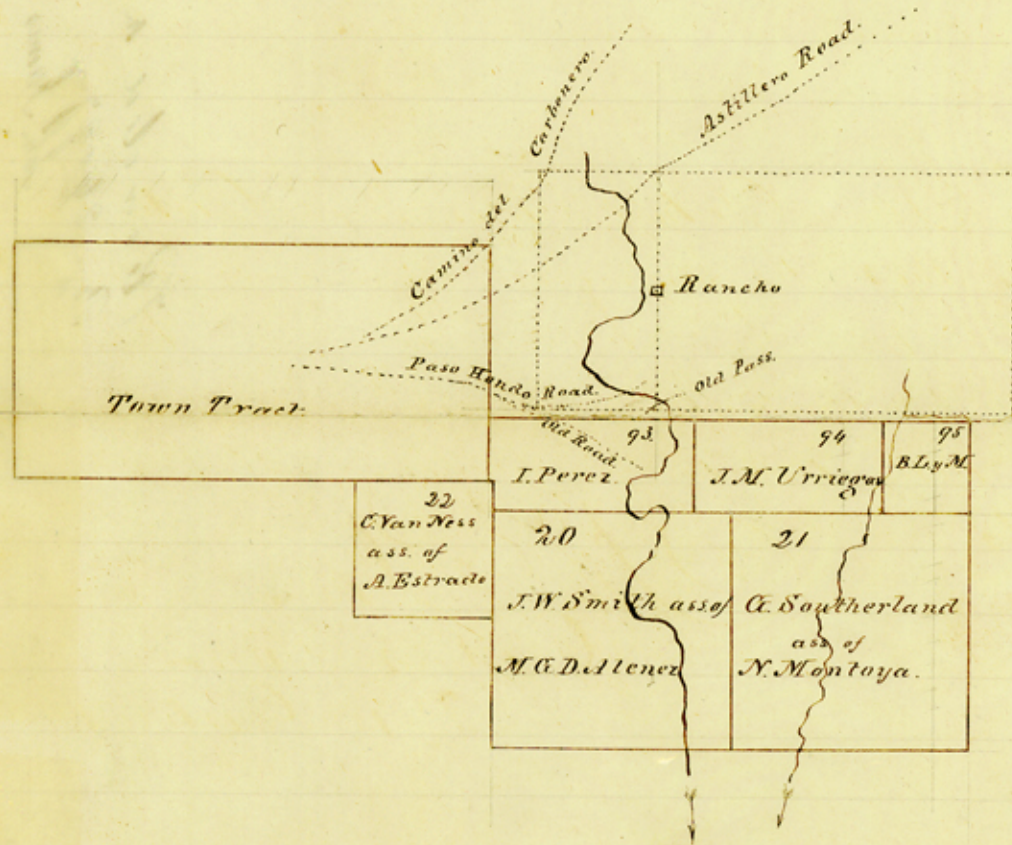
