

Field Notes of a Survey of 3 Leagues of lands
for Maria Felicitiana Duran, the wife of Andres Benito Curber.

Beginning at the Centre of the "Rancho de las Hermanas"
(the Rancho of the Sisters.) thence North along the bank of the
"Salado Creek" 2,500 Varas to a point near the road, called
"del Astillero," where a Landmark was established. — Thence
returning to the said "Rancho" run a line South along the
said Creek 2,500 Varas to the Crossing called "del Toruto,"
where a Landmark was established. — Thence East 7,500
Varas to the head of the "Cañada" called "Sorillo," where a
Landmark was established. — Thence North 5,000 Varas to
a point a little below the Hill called "Loma del Becero,"
where a Landmark was established. — Thence West 7,500
Varas to the point on the Salado Creek where the first
line terminated, which was run from the Centre of the said
"Rancho" — Thence West 2,500 Varas to a point above the
road called "del Carbonero," where a Landmark was established.
— Thence South 5,000 Varas to a point below the junction
of the "Astillero" and "Honcho" roads, where a Landmark was
established. — Thence East 2,500 Varas to the Landmark
which was set at the Crossing of the "Toruto," where this sur-
vey terminated; it being as represented in the annexed Plat.
