Field notes of a survey made for Russell
Howard assignee of the Heirs of B. D. Howard dec'd:
of a tract of Land formerly known as the San
Lucas Lands sold according to the form of Law
by the Spanish Government to the Indians of the
Mission of San José as pasture lands on the 22nd
day of November A.D. 1766. Said tract of Land
is at present more generally known as the John
McMullan Grant and is situated in the Counties
of Medina, Bexar and Atascosa -

Beginning according to the description as made
in the old deed on top of the Loma del Padron or
Padron Hill, a known hill which has the shape of
a table and is covered with brush where a pile of
rocks was placed for extreme East corner of
this survey.

Thence N. 9° W. 2970 yards to a Spring branch, 4030 yards
to Botranca Creek, 7350 yards to San Lucas Creek
9020 yards to the Medina River 17100 yards to a
strata of sand stone marked X in the bed of
the arroyo de los alamos, or cotton wood creek
at the crossing or ford on said creek where the
Pita road an old road leading from San
Antonio de Béxar to the Páridos Rio Grande
crosses the same as described in the old deed,
from which a live oak 8 in. dia. by S. 74° W 4 yards
marked X. a forked Elm 20" in dia marked X
by S. 72° E dist 3 yards - a Buck Jack 9 in. dia.

N 48° W. marked X.

Then with the meanders of said Pita Road a poll
to mit.

S. $64\frac{1}{4}$ W. 800 yards.

S. 36° W. at 2885 yards the N. W. corner of
Survey W-1 in the name of B. S. Anderson. 3315
yards to a Stake the end of this corner always
following the meanders of said old road.

South $70\frac{1}{4}$ West 3190 yards to a Black Jack
in the bed of a branch of the Atascosa Creek
Known as Negro Creek at the old crossing of said
Pita Road. Said Black Jack is 15 m. dia. and
marked X on the North side.

South $51\frac{3}{4}$ West 1860 yards to a Stake set on
the County line of Atascosa & Medina Counties.

South $49\frac{3}{4}$ West 8600 yards.

of a $\frac{1}{3}$ of a League by N 75° W. 800 yards.

Then North 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° West 32400 yards to a pile of earth
called for in the old deed for six times now corner
of this tract of land from which a live oak 18. in
dia: by S. 30° E. 34 yards marked $\frac{1}{2}$ another live
oak by N. 65° E. 10 in. dia marked $\frac{1}{2}$ X at a
distance of 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards. - And a pile of earth
also mentioned in the old deed on the corner of
a grant made to Baltazar Perez an adjoining
proprietor by N 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 630 yards. Said corner
was situated on Castro's Colony survey N^o 15 of 320
acres of land made for J. B. Hallebardier - and
the S. W. corner of Survey N^o 364 Dist 1 Castro's
Colony Medina Co in the name of Sean McHale
Peltier (now deceased) by South 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 100 yards.

Then N 72 $\frac{1}{2}$ E crossing the wall road 900 yards
to the Medina River 25 yards south of the S. E.
corner of Survey N^o 1 in the name of Wm
Stul 17180 passing through Mr. Marshback's
House to a pile with on the top of the Loma
Alta or high hill a commanding eminence
and known point mentioned in the old deed
and situated on a League & Labor survey in
the name of Juanita Delgado.
