Dear Sir-

On the 2nd day
of February A.D. 1857. I made a
160 acre survey between the Ann
Wheelock League and the Cherino
League, for N. J. King, also a 40
acre survey for W. K. King. On your
map those two surveys (the Wheelock &
Cherino) are represented as being con-
nected, but such is not the fact
there is a space between of 116¹/₂
varas, the front of the two
King surveys. The above sketch
is a true representation of their
true positions. This vacancy was
~~left~~ when the Cherino survey was
made by not finding the upper
corner of the Ann Wheelock League.
I refer you to Hon. S. P. Erath
for a confirmation of these

Facts as regards the vacancy.
