

Beginning at a live Oak tree on the dividing line between the Thomas J. Ewing and Matthew Givins Survey near Mr. Johnson's House, this point I designate as A. S. W. 7

Thence S 60 W 1000 varas to a pile of Rocks the S. E. corner of the Thomas J. Ewing tract where we found an old pile of Rock from which a Spanish Oak marked R bears S 30 E 122 varas - the old field notes calls for a live Oak marked R which bears S 30 E 1257 varas this corner I designate as B. The surveyor is in error by calling for the S. E. cor. It should read S. W. cor.

Returned to large live Oak designated A.

Thence S 1/2 W 346 varas the NW corner of the Matthew Givens Survey which in the old field notes calls for An Elm X brs N 78 W 47 varas.
