

Resurvey of the Kimball Bend Estate.

Beginning at the N.E. corner of the John Gates and S.E. corner of the Martha Baker Tracts on the Bluff of the River Brazos.

Thence S. 80 W. across road leading from Village to Bend
378 varas - Joshua R. a Cordova house bears S 72 W. a
Point of Bar Mountain bears N 65 W.
at 660 varas across a Ravine

1080 varas road leading from Village to Yarborough ford
1100 varas a Stone Mound Willinghams house bears
S 56 E. and Joshua's S 84 W.

Thence same course 550 varas across road leading from Village to Joshua's
910 varas road from Village to Marlborough Grun

1100 varas corner a Stone Mound from which a large Mus-
quite bears N 50 W. and Willinghams house (not a good sight)
bears S 86 E.

Continuing on 205 varas to a point on this line from which
Daniel Bowman's house bears N 85 1/2 W and Willinghams
house East

400 varas old Road to Marlborough Grun. Thence
passing near the head of a Ravine close to road leading to D. Bowman's

1100 a Stone Corner in a Hollow. One live Oak bears
S 1 W (large) and a small live Oak bears S 3 W.

1100 varas a Stake in a Rock Mound D. Bowman's house
bears N. 5 1/2 W.

Thence crossing the extreme point of a ridge of hills.

1132 varas a Stone corner - which is also supposed to be the
corner of the Martha Baker, a live Oak bears N 37 E. and another
S 7 E

Thence 960 varas a Stone Mound, a live Oak Grove bears
N 15 E

Thence 1425 varas a Stake and Mound on the East Bank of Crosses
Creek - being corner No. 1 on Crosses Creek.

1 10 varas across Crosses Creek a State & Mound on West Bank
 Then 495 varas to the supposed corner of the Wendenberg
 and Crottenden Survey a small mound of Pebbles
 from which a large live Oak bears $\text{N} 2 \frac{1}{2} \text{ W}$.
 Then 720 varas to the road leading from Powells to Har-

905 varas to a Rock mound on a Hill from which
 Roberts House bears $\text{S} 47 \frac{1}{2} \text{ E}$.

Then 873 varas to the supposed N.W. corner of the John

 reach the Hardin-Waldrop Survey - we run 56 varas and
 made a corner - This line had never previously been run
 A Mound of Stone from which a live Oak bears $\text{S} 43 \frac{1}{2} \text{ W} 21 \text{ m}$

but according to what we find in the measurement of
 other lines this line ought to be extended 900 or 1000
 varas further - so we went down to the Back corner of
 the J H Raymond Survey - but first - we con-
 tinued on the same course on the John Gates line
 730 varas to a State - struck a line ^{supposed to} have been abandoned ^{xxxx}

Then $\text{S} 20 \text{ W} 130$ varas - the Old Cow Roads

This corner is connected on Document B commencing at
 the J H Raymond Survey.
