The amount received by this office from you to patent 80.89 acres out of the Walter E. Eggers survey in Brazoria County, was found to be more than sufficient to accomplish this purpose.

It was found, however, that the field notes, which you submitted, were in feet instead of varas as required by law for recordation in this office and, also, were not signed by the County Surveyor or a licensed land surveyor and were not recorded in the county. These requirements are imposed by law and will have to be complied with. This office has changed the notes, submitted by you, to varas and has set the field notes up in proper form and all that is necessary is the signature of a surveyor and recordation in the County Surveyor's office! I am enclosing two copies of the notes, as corrected by this office and I imagine this matter can be attended to without too much trouble.

When we have received these notes the money will be applied and patent can issue at once.

I hope that this will satisfactorily conclude this matter and I feel that the State is being well taken care of in handling it in this way.
