Dear Sir:---Upon examining the field notes of the resurvey by you as State Surveyor of Mrs. L. Crosson's land, known as the Goat Creek country in Brewster county, I find that the following surveys have not been surveyed or corrected within the original patented calls. In the field notes for survey No. 391, C.C.S.D. & R.G.N.G.R.R.Co. cert. 237 you have entirely ignored the beginning call as patented. It calls to begin at the S.E. corner of survey No. 389 and S.W. corner of 392; thence west crossing creek at 100 varas, 200 varas to a rock mound; thence south 1900 varas to a rock mound on top of a high hill, etc. It does not call for nor mention the N.E. corner of survey No. 392, and does not conflict with No. 70, block 13, and hence no correction required of said survey. Survey No. 392 its alternate, requires correction. Survey No. 561, Texas Central Ry. Co. certificate 337 as corrected includes new territory and should be corrected as to include the strip of 138 varas between survey No. 391 and 70. Also corrected field notes are required for survey No. 362, its alternate. Survey No. 5, T.A. Stephens includes a portion of survey No. 7, block 329, patented, W.R. Taylor. State School survey No. 2, block 329, F.M. Taylor requires correction as survey No. 562, T.C. Ry. Co. will go to the south line of section 70 and 71, as the original notes of 562 call for the S.W. corner of section 70 and the sketch on said notes has its north line one and the same with the south line of survey No. 70, and under the Act of 1889 it will go to the south line of block 13.

I herewith return you the above mentioned field notes for investigation and correction, together with a blue print sketch for your information. Upon return of corrected field notes herein suggested

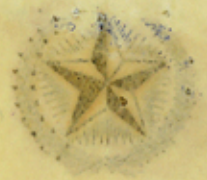
