

Surveying Report.

Fort Davis, Texas, November 8th, 1933.

The following facts are considered of important value in connection with the surveying made for Sec.12, Block 331, T.C.Ry.Co., Brewster County, Texas, at the request of J. D. Jackson, of Alpine, Texas.

First begun by using field notes for survey JH, Block 331, T.C.Ry.Co., recorded on December 13th, 1928, in Book No.1, page 384, Brewster County Records of Surveys, County Surveyor's Records, Alpine, Texas; next located on the ground the said Survey JH and Sec.8, said Block 331, easily identifying the E. Cor. said JH and N.E.Cor. said Sec.8, Block 331. From said N.E.Cor.Sec.8 surveyd S.and located N.W.Cor.Sec.12, Bl.331. Surveyed from said N.W.Cor.12 S.and at 1900 varas built a Rk.Md. and set a flag in same.

Next located and identified the N.E.Cor.Sec.34 and N.W.Cor. Sec.22, ~~####~~ Block 5, John H. Gibson, thence E.and located the N.E.Cor.said Sec.22, Block 5, and continued the said course East along the North line of said Block 5, John H. Gibson until I crossed the line I had surveyed S.from the N.W. Cor.Sec.12 as above mentioned, and by actual measurement found the intersection of the two lines were at a point 1800 varas S.from the N.W.Cor.said Sec.12, Block 331, T.C.Ry.Co.; then ~~###~~ used this point of intersection for the S.W.Cor.of Sec.12, Block 331. Unfortunately it was cloudy and foggy <sup>on mt. Jofu</sup> so that I could <sup>not</sup> take any bearings from any of the rocky ledges, mountain peaks, and other natural land marks, but as I had such marks and bearings for reference in the Field Notes of Survey JH and others, felt perfectly safe in my findings as described in the Field Notes of Sec.12 and as given above, since in 1928 I had located and identified surveys mentioned, and made many of the identification marks and bearings at that time for J.D.Jackson and Sam Harmon.
