On this, the 18th day of August, A.D. 1938, at a regular term of this court, came on to be heard the above entitled and numbered cause, wherein D. W. Light, Asa Jones, and William M. Light are plaintiffs, and I. C. Roark, Jr., F.M. Roark, Gus J. Groos, Trustee, Aetna Life Insurance Company a corporation, W. F. Boggess, Julian LaCrosse, Grady Lowrey, Mrs. Lillion F. Manning Cox, Federal Land Bank of Houston, and A. C. Williams, Trustee, are defendants, and came plaintiffs in person and by their attorney of record, and the defendants, W. F. Boggess, Julian La Crosse, and Grady Lowrey having executed and filed their waiver of the issuance and service of process herein, and the said defendant, Mrs. Lillion F. Manning Cox having been duly served with process, failed to appear or answer in this behalf, but wholly made default; and, came I. C.Roark, Jr., F. M. Roark, Gus J. Groos, Trustee, and A. C. Williams, Trustee, by their attorneys of record herein; and, came Aetna Life Insurance Company, a corporation, and Federal Land Bank of Houston, through its duly authorized officers and attorneys of record, and the court finding that all parties are properly before the court, the matters in controversy, as well of fact as of law, having been submitted to the Court, without the intervention of a jury, and the pleadings, the evidence, and the argument of counsel having been heard and fully understood, the court finds the law and facts to be for the plaintiffs:

It is, therefore, considered, adjudged, and ordered, by the court, that plaintiffs, D. W. Light, Asa Jones, and William M. Light, recover of the defendants, I. C. Roark, Jr.,

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F. M. Roark, Gus J. Groos, Trustee, Aetna Life Insurance Company, a corporation, W. F. Boggess, Julian La Crosse, Grady Lowrey, Mrs. Lillion F. Manning Cox, Federal Land Bank of Houston, and A. C. Williams, Trustee, the title and possession of the premises, described as follows, to wit:

Converting letter of March 21 et, 1936

Deer Sir:

On December 11, 1935 your letter and proposed report and sketches to the Brewster county district court in Gause #1491 John W Harris VS Daniel Rodrigues et al, was received in this department. I regret that press of business has made it impossible to write you sconer in reference to this matter.

The above information was brought to this department by yourself and Mr McGlendon, Jr of the firm of Vinson, Elkins, Sweeton & Weems of Houston. At the request I agreed to go into this matter and offer such suggestions concerning your construction as I thought might be of assistance to you in connection with your location of the surveys under consideration. I had hoped to get some outside information, which I could use as a check against your work, in order that I might advise you as to the correctness of your surveying. The several attempts which I have made to get such data have been unsuccessful and I have therefore, concluded to write you at this time, particularly following the request from Mr McGlendon dated March 14th.

I note what you have to say in reference to the location of blk D-10 as constructed from the two rock mounds at the extremity of the West line of section 63 in that block, as compared with the construction you have in mind of sections in that block from the approximate calls for position, as recited in the field notes.

Captain Dod's work in locating the corners of section 63 above mentioned ran back to Myers Springs, in which the "D" blocks take their positions, course and distance. As I see it, this is the proper construction to give blk D-10. It is true that in field notes by Archer, he gives the course and distance position in the

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the Your description, however, I think, should be considered only ap-approximately or generic and without locative value, except in a very general sense. I know of one survey in Brewster county, made many years ago, in which the course and distance from the court house in San Antonio are recited.

> As to blk G-18, I believe you have properly constructed that block as far as the line running West from the monument at the mouth of San Francisco creel is concerned, as well as the line forming the East boundary of sections 107-108-109-110-85, etc is affected. This applies also to the surveys North and West of those two lines. In your report you do not state how you determined the courses and distances of the river surveys in this block. My conclusion is that survey 95 should begin at the above mentioned monument on San Francisco Creek, going West and South course and distance; thence East to the river.

Section 96 should begin at the SE corner of 95, go West and South, course and distance; thence East to the river, and so from on, down thru section 102, giving the first cell to the beginning corner West, and the second call South the distances mentioned in the field notes, and then in each case, running East to the river.

I have examined the field notes of the surveys in blk M-2 and find that Gano, in beginning work at the SW corner of section 1 in this block, called for a rock mound on the river with certain bearings at 45 varas below Cavalry Matering Trail, which enters the Rio Grande Valley from a deep canyon.

At the SE corner of survey 13 a bearing to a large spring is recited. At the SE corner of section 19 a rock mound is men-tioned at the head of a fall, at the mouth of an arroyo, which falls into a basin resembling a horse shoe, course given as S 65 W 585 varas. At the SE corner of survey 27, a rock mound is called for above the mouth of the and I arroy0, bears N 1320 E 2516 varas. The desired bends in the river along the South lines of surveys 19 and 21 should also have important locative value in checking the correct positions to be given these survey corners. From what I have been told, a survey made in this vicinity of more or less recent date, developed the fact that this trail at the old Cavalry Matering place can now be dotermined, and that Gano's mean-der line will fit the above bend on surveys 19 and 21 very closely.

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It occurs to me that it may be necessary to check on such point by triangulation or otherwise, to be certain that you have given these surveys in olk M-2 their correct position East and West. If that is done, the procedure of locating the back lines would be the same as that mentioned above for the river surveys in blk G-18. Having located these surveys, as mentioned above, the Thos Duggan, Mary E Crosby and E J Birmingham surveys would take up the vacancy between blk M-2 on the South, and blk G-18 and G-21 on the North.

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In view of the fact that this matter is before the disfor trict court adjudication, what I have said above is purely in the way of suggestions for your consideration in connection with the proper construction of the surveys referred to.

I am sending a carbon copy of this letter to Mr S S McClendon, Jr., c/o Vinson, Elkins, Sweeton & Weems, Niels-Esperson Bldg., Houston, for his information.

I also return your surveyor's report and the two blue print sketches, which you brought to this department on December 11, 1935.

Let me suggest that if at a future date it is desired to file field notes of any of these surveys above mentioned, that you not only furnish a complete report of the work done, but that you submit with it a map showing your work on vellum or tracing cloth. It is now a ruling of this department that maps and sketches, to be filed in this office as archives, must be of as permanent a nature as can be consistently done without too heavy expenses. Therefore, tracing cloth sketches are desired.
