Upon further investigation I have decided
the Original construction of these Sections is
more nearly correct, that is building from the
point in the SE 1/4 Sec. 6-Blk. 240.

The corner found could have been made to
serve as the original corner but by using some
imagination on a scattered rock pile and changing
the variation a degree or more in the vicinity of
where the original location should be the bearings
can be made to all fit.

So in view of the facts that the corner
found is so far out of line and the original
location can be made to check the three bearings
with a scattered rock pile I believe the Original
Location should be used and authorize you to
make the changes on the map accordingly.
