 never at the corner of M10 when he surveyed
 158 because the NW corner of M10 is out on the
 open plain 1. mile 253 varies from the nearest
 part of the break where an oak tree ever grew
 they do not ever grow in this country away from the
 canons or breaks where there is water. At 2053 varies
 from the NW corner of M10 there is an oak
 stump on the brink of the canon about 10 in dia
 which could have been readily seen while surveying
 the south line of 158 M10 before the tree was cut down
 said oak stump will bear N 71 E 470 varies
 from a point 2053 N from the NW corner of
 M10
