Gentlemen:-

Concerning the S.E. corner of Briscoe County:

The stone monument marking this corner is either removed or buried in drifting sand but Mr. G.A.Lider furnished me notes to a connection made to it by him when he surveyed Block 3, T.&P land which gives it as being 1202.4 varas south and 774.6 varas west of the S.E. corner of section No. 65, Block 3. I investigated this place and found it a sandy field with some ridges and other places where the sand was blown out but no sign of any rock.

However, there are some china tree sprouts on a sand dune the right distance S.59°W. to correspond with the bearing called for as S.59°W. 176 varas from the S.E. corner of Briscoe County. China trees sprout from the roots and there are no more china trees in the neighborhood. All trees of any size have long since been cut down for post or wood which accounts for absence of bearing trees.

This position also fits with the position of the corner as shown on map in your office in connection with Block XX and signed by Jno. S. Mason, County Surveyor, Briscoe County.

The N.W. Corner of Motley County, a stone 7x11 inches by 3 feet above ground and marked N.W.M, is N.25°58'E. 216 varas from G.A.Lider's S.W. corner Section No. 34, Block 3. ~~making xxxxxxxxxx~~ or North 194.2 varas and East 94.6 varas. and the interval between the county corners is 5 miles, 1032 varas east west and about 300 north and south. The Stone for N.W.Motley seems to be 516 varas too far west and 300 too far south to fit the Briscoe Corner.

I feel sure of the position of the S.E. corner of Briscoe County for the Lider connection, the Mason Connection and the china trees now standing all point to a spot not over 20 varas ~~wide~~ across. My little map of the east part of Block XX shows the relative positions of Lider's location of Block 3 and the position held and claimed on the ground for Block XX.

Location of Block 3 and the position held and claimed on the ground map of the east part of Block XX shows the relative positions of Liger's standing oil point to a spot not over 30 yards from the corner of Liger's for the Liger connection, the Mason Connection and the China trees now
I feel sure of the position of the S.E. corner of Briscoe County to fit the Briscoe Corner.

For W.W. McElroy seems to be 216 yards too far west and 300 too far south as 2 miles, 1038 yards east west and about 300 north and south. The Stone area and East 94.6 yards and the interval between the county corners corner section No. 34, Block 3, marking the corner or North 194.8. Ground and marked N.W.M., is N. 82° 55' E. 216 yards from G.A. Liger's S.W.

The W.W. corner of McElroy County's stone will indeed be 2 feet above Mason, County Surveyor, Briscoe County.
