### *H.B. Torver Sketch & Statement.*

10 Mi. N. 40° E Brownwood.

Surveyors Office  
Brownwood Texas  
May 16th 1873

I now distinctly & surely certify  
that the N E corner of the Davis  
Col Survey No 81 that the Bearing  
true a "Post Oak" as described in the  
Field Notes of said N<sup>o</sup> 81 standing  
on the "west" bank of a branch cuts  
the said cor on the "east bank" of

Same branch is still standing.

That the SW corner of No 81 & the SE cor of No 87 both called for as one and the same & on the North line of said No. 81. The "Live Oak" is still standing. The "Elm" on west bank of branch is gone but roots of an "Elm" are still visible on the "best" bank of a branch of salt creek.

That the NW corner corner of said No. 81. no cotton wood can be found. That this line measured is a mile along the line running E. & W. At a point 4 rods west of Saline said blazed line crosses Salt Creek. Then South 50 rd Salt Creek 850 rd. Salt Creek 1984 rd. a point from whence a P.O. X 20 is due bis. N 78 $\frac{1}{2}$  E 110 rd. Supposed this to be the NE cor of J. Boyd No 77 and across Salt Creek (leaving it on the East) 3 850 rd. Then West 1910 rd. to a point a Black Jack 4 rd bis N 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  W 3 & a do 4 rd N 60 W 6 rd. both these trees suit the beginning cor of said No 77 and NE cor of No 76. Then South with a blazed line 900 rd to a point on South bank of a ravine a Post Oak bis S 84 E 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  rd & a do N 78 $\frac{1}{2}$

qrs. These trees are marked as called for in the bear notes of Survey No<sup>o</sup> 6 & 81. 1940 rs. (having crossed a bank of salt cut) to a point a Spanish Oak 21 in N 13 W 21 rs. Standing on the bank of salt cut 8 W of N<sup>o</sup> 81.

Planted East crossing salt cut 3 times 1900 rs.

Planted South 1900 rs.

(This makes the length of the line 2 1/2 miles. found no marks of any kind. though in P.O. timber) 3815 rs to a point 2277 rs East of the W K Dalton Survey N<sup>o</sup> This has a stone mound a P.O. 15 in his N 5<sup>h</sup> E 20 & a live Oak 12 M. 20 1/2 q. found both of these trees.

Standing this corner marked "A" in sketch at the end of "3815 rs South" searched diligently for a corner and cleared line & found none though in thick P.O. timber

The courses and distances set for above were run by me on the ground and found to be as given above - and found the marks on the bearing trees called for above to be the same as described and called for in the copies of field notes of the respective surveys

That the SW corner of Survey No 7 made for H. L. & B. R. R. by me in 1869. was made 4470 as East of the main A. in attached sketch and that said distance was run and measured by me on the ground and I still have the notes <sup>this measurement</sup> upon the ground now up and running.

That B. is intended for the SE cor of said No. 81.

That from B. Run South 84 rs. & West 141 rs to the S Econ of Survey No. 53.

That the sketch is made a part of this report and that the distances marked on said sketch are true and correct from actual measuring on the ground
