Hodges is situated on the south side of Old River, adjoining and above the quarter league surveyed to Charles Tilton. And from the upper corner of said Tilton, following the meanders of the River up, a line was run North 30 West 1420 varas. Thence North 48°West 190 varas. Thence North 16°West 130 varas. Thence North 37°West 290 varas. Thence North 39°West 140 varas. Thence North 80 West 200 varas. Thence South 72 West 220 varas. Thence South 49°West 200 varas. Thence South 24 West 480 varas. Thence North 87°West 270 varas. Thence North 490West 230 varas. Thence North 200 varas. There North 20°East 50 varas. Thence North 43°East 120 varas. Thence North 8ºEast 120 varas. Thence North 16ºWest 90 varas. Thence North 670West 70 varas. Thence North 87ºWest 130 varas. Thence South 68ºWest 300 varas. Thence South 36°West 280 varas. Thence North 84°West 150 wras. Thence North 750West 270 varas. Thence North 8°West 380 varas to the lower corner of the league surveyed to Henry Griffith which is a landmark. Thence South 60 West 6850 varas to a stake in a mound of earth which is a landmark. Thence South 30°East 3000 varas to another stake in a mound of earth which is a landmak. Thence North 60°East 8600 varas to the first landmark and completing one league of land; of which, five million square varas or, what is the same, five labors belong to the class of arable land and the remainder to that of pastureland, its configuration being that shown.

We, said Commissioner Baron de Bastrop and Empresario Stephen F. Austin, the witnesses, Preskey Gill, Christian Smith, John Jiams, the surveyor, Isaac Hughes, and the interested party, William Bloodgood, went to the said league which, by the preceding act, we have granted to this last and which is situated on Cedar Creek five leagues, more or less, above its mouth on the east side of San Jacinto Bay. And from a point where a landmark was set in the prairie on the east side of said creek, the surveyor began. Thence he measured 5000 varas South 920East where another landmark was set. Thence South 802 West 5000 varas crossing Cedar Creek to where a landmark was set. Thence North920West 5000 varas to where set another landmark a distance of 1 vara from an elm North 50° West and 6 varas from an oak South 25°West, both marked WB. Thence North 80 20 West 5000 varas crossing said creek again to where the first line began, comprising within all these lines the area of one league of land and being contiguous on all sides with facant lands of the nation.

The league of land surveyed to Henery Griffriffith is situated on the south margin of Old River, adjoining and below a quarter league that is vacant; from the northeast corner of said quarter league a gum 8 inches in diameter bears North 420West 8 varas distant and a white oak 12 inches in diameter bears South 12ºWest 7 varas distant. Thenee Thence South 60°West 7800 varas to a stake which is a landmark. Thence South 30 East 2450 varas to the intersection of the north boundary line of the league surveyed to William Bloodgood. From where another line was run East 250 varas to the northeast corner of said Bloodgood. Thence South 500 varas, following said Bloodgood's east boundary line, to a stake which and thence following the meanders of the river up is a landmark. Thence North 60 East 9000 varas/to the place of beginning and completing one league; ten million square varas or which or, what is the same, ten labors belong to the class of arable land and the remainder to that of pasture land. Its timber is pine, oak, gum etc. and its configuration is that shown.----Stricken out - "Griffriffith" - "Thence" - incorrect.
