Corrected field notes of a survey of the meanders of the shore line at Mean High Tide, of Turtle Bay and certain surrounding partially submerged lands, in Chambers County, Texas; said Bay being bounded on West by the E.H.R. Wallis, Xavier Becaro and E. Wood original surveys; on the North by the E.H.R. Wallis, Joseph LaFour, S. Burney, M.A. Carroll and the Green B. Jamison original surveys; on the East by the Green B. Jamison, Charles Baxter, L.D. Stamps, N. Morse, C. Baxter, J.H. Blume, John R. Jenny, David Wallace, J.H. Sherman, E.D. Sherman, L. Sherman and the G.E. Willcox original surveys; and on the South by the Trinity River Islands and the Charles Willcox League.

The said meanders together with certain ties, connecting lines and references are particularly described by courses and distances as follows:-

BEGINNING at a point, S. 6°00' W., 25.63 Varas from a 3/4" iron pipe in concrete Monument, said Monument being on a common line between the G.B. Jamison and the C. Baxter original surveys and bearing S.88° 10' W., 916.56 Varas from the South East corner of the G.B. Jamison original survey.
