Dear Sir:

I am submitting herewith report on the location of the Cherokee-Rusk County boundary line at the Northeast corner of Cherokee County, made in accordance with the order of your Court.

On April 1, 1935 the following parties, L. T. Moore, County Surveyor, and Tom Eidson and Jack Fitts his assistances, C. F. Click, County Engineer, and D. W. Heard and D. V. Frazer assistances, went upon the ground for the purposes of finding the Cherokee-Rusk County line as established by Hill and Thompson in 1906, as recorded in Vol. E, pages 329-334, Commissioners Court Records, Cherokee County, Texas.

Assuming the line as established by Hill and Thompson in 1906 as the correct and accepted Cherokee-Rusk County boundary line, the work was based on notes obtained from said records, and the Northeast corner of Cherokee County, same being the Southeast corner of Smith County, was very readily located. At that time their notes called for a corner from which a double red oak 18 inches in diameter marked W.B.R.C. brs. S. 64 degrees E. 10 vrs.; A red oak 12 inches marked S.E.C.S.C. brs. N.  $82\frac{1}{2}$  degrees W.  $17\frac{1}{2}$  vrs.; A red oak 12 inches marked N.E.C.C.C. brs. S.  $5\frac{1}{2}$  degrees W. 14 vrs.. From these trees an old wood stake and pieces of an old hoe was found burried about six inches under the ground in an earthen mound, and which plainly indicated the exact corner as originally established.

The double red oak as called for was cut down, while the stump was left in place. The red oak which called for S.  $5\frac{1}{2}$  degrees W. 14 vrs. was also cut and the stump left in place. The trunks of these trees were lying on the ground and on them the markings were found. The red oak which brs.  $82\frac{1}{2}$  degrees W.  $17\frac{1}{2}$  vrs. is still standing and the marking S.E.S.C. on same is visible.

Therefore, beginning at the center of the wood stake as found and referenced as the N. E. corner of Cherokee County, same being the S. E. corner of Smith County, a line was run, South with the said line between the said Counties. At 116 varas the Marathon Oil Co., M. M. Cross Well No. 20, E. B. Foulks Survey, brs. West 121.8 varas. At 312.8 vrs. the Marathon Oil Co., M. M. Cross Well No. 18, E. B.

Foulks Survey, brs. West 51.8 vrs.. At 549.8 vrs., the Marathon Oil Co., M. M. Cross Well No. 9, E. B. Foulks Survey, brs. West 48.8 vrs.. At 2244 vrs. a 20 inch red oak was found on the line marked R.C. on the East side and C.C. on the West side. This red oak, no doubt, being the same tree as described in the original notes prepared by Hill and Thompson which called for at 2237 vrs. a black oak 20 inches marked R. C. and C. C.

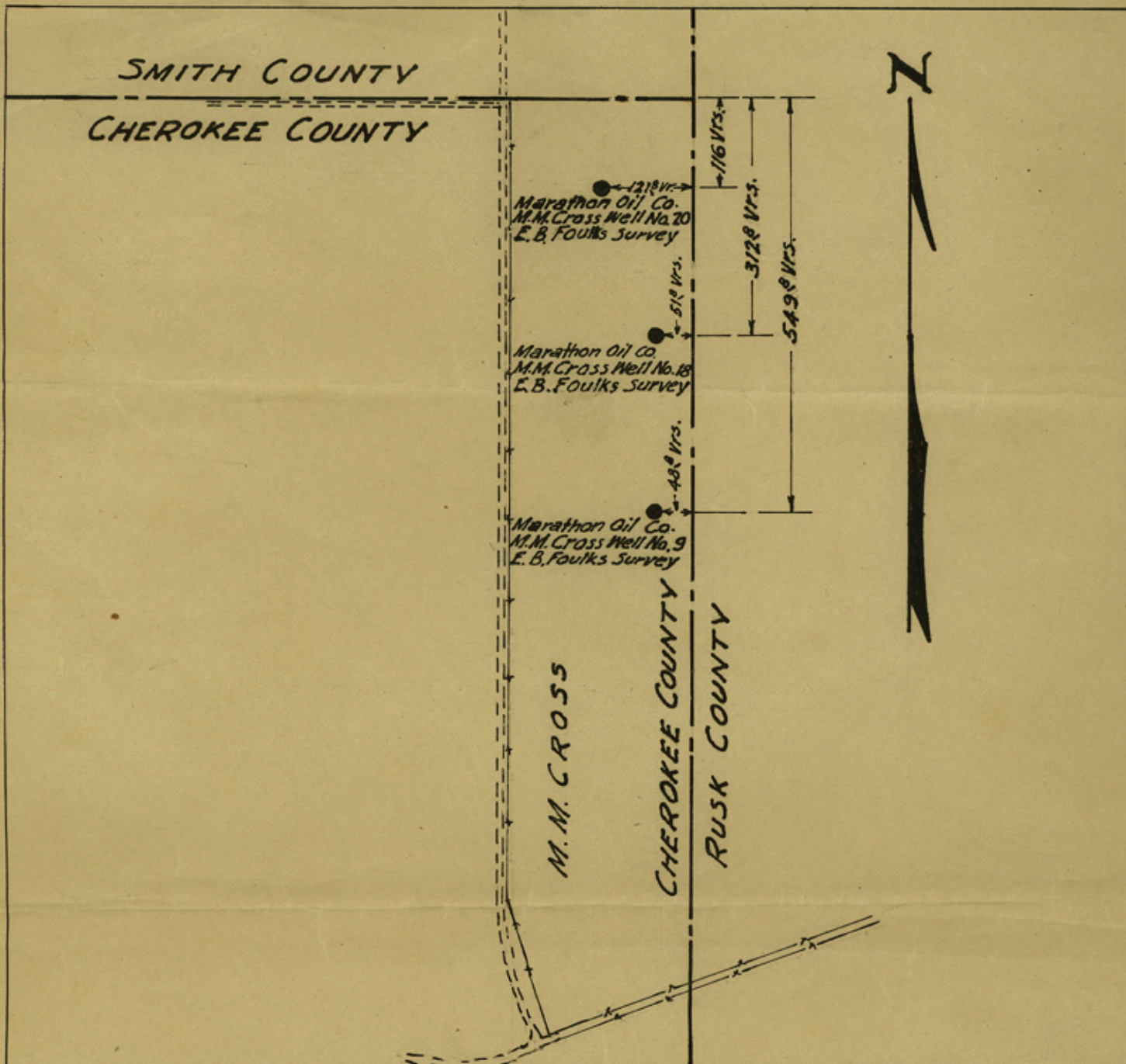
From the above findings it was concluded that the line established by Hill and Thompson had been located exactly.
