three lines across the Block.
Work on the ground would
go to show that line from

There are three other corners in this block of the original location but are more irregular than those reported.

The S.W. cor. No 60 is 6 miles + 400 yds South of S. E. cor No 182 and is a stone mound, with Coll. W. bearing as described in field notes. The N.W. cor No 71 same block or field bearing true plainly marked but no stone md. or stake, but by the field notes place this corner six miles + about 400 yds East S.W. cor No 60. The N.E. corner No 30 can be identified as original work but is two or

proper place, compared with
S. E. cor. No 182 + the 2 rec'd cor.
both same block.

The survey of this block could
have been located definitely
as the lines cross creeks and
cauons, and there is a consid-
erable growth of cotton wood
Hackberry + c and an abun-
dance of stone out of which
to construct corner + take
bearings. The original corners
where found are altogether
unreliable when compared
with other corners in the block
and certainly need to be re-
constructed. I refer you
