strenuously insist that to do so would be to
do myself and other parties interested in
lands adjoining said Block on the east
an injustice. I insist that the excess
in Block H between No 1 and the point
where the North line of the block crosses
Grossbeck Creek should be equally
distributed. ~~that~~ ^{is worthless} the title Wandering
Creek for the reason that on the
ground it does not fit on the creek and
is entirely inconsistent with every
other call for the creek, that the calls
for wandering creek are as is the
case with nearly all the creeks and
branches called for in Block H. Mere
guess work. That the excess above
spoken of is much greater than
shown by Westmoreland's connect-
ing line. That, I have almost con-
clusive proof, that W. J. Westmoreland's
motion was to induce me to float

My scrip in order that he might
locate some scrip in which he had
a locative interest. That I the said
J. A. Nabers are just as much en-
titled to my rights in the prem-
ises as the H. C. T. & R. R. Co are
