



The State of Texas I, W.W. Howeth Special Deputy Surveyor, do hereby certify, that the above sketch is a true map of surveys in this county, as represented, and that the connections represented by red lines were made upon the ground, and that all the corners therein connected, are well defined by stones, & bearing trees, except the N.W. cor. of J.H. King Sur: & S.E. cor. of the Ed. Hall, and that the blue lines show the boundary lines of survey actually run and measured. And that the S.B. line of the S. Denson 160 acre Survey is 1300 rods & not 936, both the S.W. & S.E. corners being well defined by stones & witness trees, & that the N.W. cor. is identifiably bearing, and that the E.B. line of same is 973 rods, & not 964 rods. And that the distance from the N.W. cor. of J.H. King Survey to S.E. cor. of Ed. Hall Sur. is 932 rods and that the connecting lines are the courses and distances as represented herein,
