Sir

In explanation of the position of the surveys lying on Red and Big Wichita Rivers near the N.B. line of Clay Co. as shown by my connecting line run on the 23^d of February 1882. I will say that I began at a pile of stone established as the lower corner of the Jonas English while its bearing trees were standing (they are now gone) which point agrees with the call made for the J.C. Bailey sur. on the opposite side of the river, and I have no doubt is correct. From this corner I run as represented in the connecting line above mentioned to the S.E. corner of the H Hastie sur. which corner I had previously established as follows to wit: Beginning at the N.W. corner of the B. Brown N^o 808. Thence East 1344 vs. a point from which a pecan tree N 5 1/2 E 8 vs. (the Elm bearing is gone) Thence South. 1344 vs the S.E. cor of said Brown. and the N.E. corner of

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the H Hartie above mentioned

Thence South. 3265 vs. a stone his S.E. cor

I then began at the lower or S.E. cor of the A.E. Gossett sur on the N bank of Big Wichita river, which corner I had established from the original bearings (one of which is now gone) and run N45 W. 1718 vs. to N cor of said Gossett sur. Thence S45 W. 700 vs.

Thence N45 W. 1735 vs. the N corner of F Longardio sur. Thence S45 W. 1100 vs. Thence N45 W. 336 vs. Thence S45 W. 1900 vs. Thence S45 E 1900 vs. Thence S45 W. 920 vs. the N.E. line of the J N Crenshaw sur.

I also began at the S.W. corner of the B Kellogg sur. established by me from the bearing called for at its N.W. corner, and run South 1600 vs. to the N.W. cor of Thos Parker sur.

Thence South 1660 vs. to a stake Thence N77 E. 824 vs. to the N corner of A.E. Gossett sur.

I will say in this connection that I have not been able to find any of the corners

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between the Jonas English and A. C. Jonett
and that I have searched dilligently for
them. a large part of the timber here
has been cut. and I think the bearing
trees have been destroyed in that way.
hoping the above explanation will enable
you to determine the condition of this work
