Dear Sir:-

Your letter of the 14th, just received, and in reply will say that my records show the NW corner of Cochran County to be;

Lat $33^{\circ}49' 29.182''$
Long. $103^{\circ}02' 36.820''$

This places the Texas-New Mexico state line along the west side of Lg. 164 approximately 4783 varas west of the true 103° meridian (astronomic).

John H. Clark in 1859-60 first surveyed and marked the said State line; Congress January 15th, 1901, see H.R. Document 259, 59th, Congress, first session, approved a resurvey by A.D. Kidder, who determined that the north end of the line to be Long. $103^{\circ} 2' 13.80''$ and the south end to be $103^{\circ}3' 55.52''$ and Congress February 16th, 1911, 36Sta.1455, declared the boundary line as run by Clark and rechecked by Kidder "Shall remain the true boundary line of Texas and New Mexico."

From this information you can see that your file S.F. 13596 is and has always been west of the 103 meridian.
