CHAPTER LXVI.

AN ACT MAKING THE OFFICE OF COUNTY SURVEYOR AN OFFICE OF RECORD.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas, That the Surveyors of the several counties of this State shall record in a well bound book all the Surveys in the County or district for which he was elected, with the plats thereof, that he may make, whether private or official, and that such record shall be open to the inspection of the public; and for which services the Surveyor may charge, in addition to the fees now allowed by law for field work, twenty cents per hundred words for such record.

SEC. 2. Certified copies of such record, under the official signature of the County Surveyor, may be used in evidence in any of the Courts of this State.

SEC. 3. The Commissioners' Courts are herewith required to furnish the County Surveyors of their respective Counties, on the requisition of such Surveyors, a book or books of sufficient capacity to contain a record of all the Surveys provided for in this Act.

Approved March 30, A. D. 1881.
