Statement of O. W. Williams
relation to original Comers to Survey in Crosby
Lubbock, Hale & Floyd Counties, -

In the summer of 1877 in conjunction with J. B.
Ammerson I ran a line from Survey Lake (End)
in Crosby County - up the Blanco Canon to a point
on the old McKeegie trail about 6 miles N.W. of the (then
called) Taster House (now I think occupied by H.C.
Smith) - At this point (supposed to be on South
Boundary line of Floyd County) we erected a small
earth mound by the side of the trail. - Continuing
on up the trail some 70 miles more - we erected a
pretty fair sized earth mound close to where the Mc
Keegie trail crossed a draw or arroyo which we sup-
posed to be the draw of Upper Catfish Creek.

This was a corner (I think the N.W. cor of Sec 1) of a
Survey in D.L. S.R. C. Block C. - There were no
buildings - no marks of habitation - except that it seems
to me there ~~were~~ ^{were} 1 or 2 small rocky in the mound.

- Our Survey continued West along said McKeegie trail
some 6 or 8 miles further to a dry lake about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile North of
the trail - which was then full of water which we
named India Lake - in honor of some Seminole
Indians Ammersons I think. - On the West side
of this small lake - we erected a sod mound some
6 feet high capped with 7 buffalo heads. - From
this point we turned back to the earth mound on
the County Boundary of Floyd - to -

From this point we surveyed West until we came to
where the draw of North Fork of Yellowhouse Canon
crossed the North line of Lubbock County. - Here on
the divide about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile East of the draw we erected
an earth mound. - From thence - we meandered
the Yellowhouse as far as mouth of Plum Creek where we
erected a stone mound on a hill just East of mouth of
Plum Creek. -

1 We started this Survey from East end of Deary's Lake
2 Supposing it to be on East line of Survey 37, Block
3 28 At & N. Ry. Deary's - and Survey's are made
4 in Block "C" Floyd Co. - "R" - rather Hale County
5 & Blocks "A" & "B" Lubbock County. - based on this
6 connection. if Deary's Lake is not on East line
7 of Survey 37 Block 28 as its calls declare - then
8 the Survey's in the Blocks I have enumerated
9 due to Deary's Lake & not to Survey 37 Block 28 -

10 In the summer of 1878 I accom-
11 paied E.M. Powell of Dallas in a Survey which
12 commenced in the center of Lubbock County - at the
13 Forks of the Yellowhouse - We erected a rock mound
14 at S.W. corner of Survey 1 Block A. as closely as we could
15 approximate to the field notes of said Survey No 1 -
16 From this as a starting point - we ran South & East
17 down the Yellowhouse - putting up rock cones
18 Every mile down the Yellowhouse - on Block S. -

19 We then returned & beginning again at S.W.
20 corner Survey No 1 Block A. we surveyed North up the
21 North fork - Surveying entirely by right angles - East
22 & North - & finally erecting an earth mound at ~~N.E.~~ N.W.
23 corner of Survey No 1 Block ~~S.~~ S. E. & N. W.
24 corner of Survey No 1 Block S. S. E. & N. W.
25 at East side of Lamb Co. - and just North of a sipe
26 Spring or water-hole in the bed of the draw of
27 North Fork. -

28 We then ran North across the sand hills to Upper
29 Catfish Creek - Running down the Creek to established
30 corners on Survey 1 Block S. B. & some Survey's on Block
31 K & K 3 -

32 From this it will be seen that Blocks "S.E." "E2." "AK"
"T.S." "D" "D2" "D3" "D4" "D5" "P." "X" "CK" & "P." in Lubbock

"K3" & "K"

County & Block D.T. "D 10" in Hale Co. - "A" & J.B. Lamb Co.
tie really to a point 650 yards South of S.E. corner of
Dearys Lake.

On Dec² 1878 & Jan^y 1879 - Mr. Summerfield & I ran a
joint line from Dearys Lake to Blocks "K" & "J.K"
Hale County - We accepted Southeast corner of Dearys
Lake as being 650 yards North of S.E. corner Deary 3^y
Block 28 - & established from that the relative position
of certain Blocks in N.W. part of Hale Co. - We
supposed on our establishing this position relative
to S.E. corner of said Deary 3^y - but in reality, only
establishing their situation relative to a point
650 yards S. of E. end of Dearys Lake - This line
was accepted at G.L.C. as determining the situa-
tion of the Blocks in N.W. part of Hale Co. & the L.C.
Map of that part of County are based on that line.

The Blocks thus certainly tied to Dearys
Lake instead of Deary 3^y - are "O" "O 2" "J.K"
"J.K 2" "O 6" "S" "S 4" "C 3" "J.K 2" "J.K 3"
"M 13" &

It is my impression also that Blocks "A 1" "A 2" "A 3"
"A 4" "W" "D 7" "D 6" "D 8" "N" "C L" "K" Hale County
& "C" "R. G" "B 9" "D 7" "C 2" "H" Lubbock Co. &
"M" "B" Crosby Co. - are in same condition - but as to this,
I am not certain - Mr. J.B. Anneman -
or Mr. C. U. Connelley - ~~Connelley~~ would probably know
these facts -
