Dear Sir:-

A few weeks since I.
was called on to make an official examination of some work
in the N.W. portion of Range or Section portion of Crosby counties
in order to ascertain the amount of K. Aycock lands in Blocks
1-3 & 4, N. formerly sold to said Aycock under the 50th law, which
resulted as follows to wit. first I went to the N.E. corner of
Survey No 13. Block No B.9. E. L. & R.R. Ry. Co. in Crosby Co. which
corner is a stone marked bearing N. 281. varas and E. 176. varas
from the initial monument of Block B.9. situated S. of the
mouth of Plum creek which monument I. identified as the
monument called for in field notes of Survey No 1. of said Bl.
from the N.E. corner of 13. I. ran a trial line W. to see if
I. could make any of the calls. for creeks fit the calls in the
notes. I. found Plum creek in 450. ^{varas} crossed the Yellow House creek
at 1780. varas course S.E. leaving the creek to my N. then I. moved
south to a point that seemed to have once been the creek
+ I. ran N. 450. varas (according to the field notes) whence I. ran W.
two miles but could not make any of the crossings fit
the calls, I. returned to the N.E. corner and ran S. and found
the Yellow House (or North Fork as is called) at 2030. varas
instead of 1850. varas as given in field notes. under the circumstances
I. disregarded the creeks and relied on course and distance only
continued S. 3 miles in all and established the S.E. corner of Survey
No 730. in said Bl. B.9. whence I. went to the N.W. corner of
Survey No 141. Bl. 28 N. & S. Ry. Co. on White River and ran a
very careful line S. 13. miles and W. Eleven miles there I. iden-
tified the natural call. for the S.E. corner of Survey No 1101. J. T.
Ry. Co. 2. Cattanwood 12 & 18 inches S. 45. m about 400 varas to
larger tree is intact and plainly marked facing the course called
for the smaller one has been blown off about 5 feet from the
ground the stump is 17 inches in diameter and the tree is over

18 inches now, my distance on the m. course was short 700. veras
but in N & S. the course was very accurate, I. made no allowance
for excuses except sufficient to equalize steps &c. I. established
a milled of stone N. H^o. E. from said cottonwoods distant 400.
varas. Then I. ran south two miles and 1758. varas to the N.
line of Survey N^o 1111. I. in N. G. Ry. Co. Thence W. 555. varas to
the top of Duffys Peak at 1575. varas I. found the stone milled
N.W. corner of N 1111. 960. veras W. of Peak. Then I. ran S. 5 miles
and 100. veras to the N. line of Survey N^o 1202, ^{T.T. Ry.} Then W. crossing
Yellow Horse 3 times the latter at 1535. varas at 2395. varas I. found
the stone milled called for in field notes of Survey N^o 1201, S.S.
Ry. Co. and 1203. I. in G. N. Ry. Co. in the milled I. found a black
battle in which I. found a paper partly decayed on which I. identi-
fied the rates as given in the calls of the aforesaid surveys
most of the notes were quite plain. Then I. ran west 10200. veras
and found the S.E. corner of Survey N^o 1239. R.W.W. Ry. Co. two
large pits on oblong ridge the W. end of which bears S. H. E.
Then I. ran N. observing course and distance only (there
being no natural calls on the line) Six miles 283. varas the
point for the ^{N.W. corner} N.W. corner of the same Survey. Then 3. H. 450. varas Then N. two
miles to the N.E. corner of Survey N^o 3. E. L. & R.R. Ry. Co. from
which I. found the S.E. corner of Survey N^o 730. Bl. B. G. as aforesaid
said to bear N. 700. varas and W. 2336. varas, herewith I. send you
a sketch showing the position of the several blocks a the result
of my work. in Bl. H. Aycock lands. Surveys 14 & 16. are short 51.
acres each. and 17. H. 73. acres. Surveys 15. 20. 23. and 25. clasped making a short-
age in Bl. H. of 4055 acres. in Bl. 3. Survey N^o 5. is clasped making
a shortage of 634. acres in Bl. 3. I. suppose the file carried off appearing
between Blks. 4. & 5. hence I. adhere to beginning calls but change the
positions of Survey nos. H. Bl. H. Sur. 1. 2. 3. 4. Bl. 3. and 6. in Bl. 1.
and get 640. acres each, which is all the surveys that I. was employed
to investigate. I. W. Marshall Surveyor of Mitchell Land District do
