Dear Mr. Farmer:

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With reference to our letter of January 21, 1949, and our conference of today relative to Blocks 65 and 78, Public School Land, located in Culberson County, it was decided that the construction for these two blocks shall be as set out in our letter of January 21, 1949, with the exception of the paragraph relating to the distribution of the excess found in these two blocks.

This construction is as follows: The corner set by Frank F. Friend for the southeast and southwest corners of University Land Block No. 48 shall be adopted for the northeast corner and the northwest corner of Block 65, Public School Land.

The southwest corner of Block No. 78 is to be located from the northeast corner of Block 65, Township 10, T. & P. Ry. Co., in accordance with the call in the field notes of Survey No. 48, Block 64, for its southeast corner and the southwest corner of Block No. 78.

The southeast corner of Dlock No. 78 is to be established at a point six miles due east from the southwest corner of Block No. 78 as described above. The west boundary lines of Blocks 65 and 78, Public School Land, will then be a continuous line connecting the southwest corner of State University Block 48, as set by Frank F. Friend, and the corner established for the southwest corner of Block 78, and the east boundary lines of Blocks 65 and 78, Public School Land, will be a continuous line from the southeast corner of University Block 48 to the corner set for the southeast corner of Block 78 at a point six miles due east from the southwest corner of Block 78 as established and described above.

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The boundary line between Blocks 65 and 78, Public School Land shall then be located parallel to the south line of University Block No. 48 at points four miles south from the southwest and southeast corners of Block No. 48 on the east and west boundary lines of Blocks 65 and 78 as described.

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Such excess as shall develop by this construction in Block 78, Public School Land, is to be equally distributed north and south. ?

Dear Mr. Farmer:

This is with further reference to the distribution of excess in the surveys located in Block No. 78, PSL, Culberson County, as discussed and agreed upon during your recent visit to this office.

In our letter of March 22, 1949, last paragraph, it was set out that the excess should be equally distributed North and South.

It has now been agreed upon that the West line of this block (78) shall be the base line, and the excess distance along same shall be distributed equally to Sections 6, 7, 18 and 19.

The East-West boundary lines shall all be parallel to the South boundary line of this block with the exception of the North boundary line, which shall be parallel to the South line of University Land, Block No. 48.

The acreage in the triangular strip developed by producing a line from the Northwest corner of Section 6, Block No. 78, parallel to the South boundary line of Block No. 78, and projecting a line from this same corner parallel to the South boundary line of State University Land, Block No. 48, shall be added to the North tier of Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, & 6, in Block No. 78, thereby increasing the excess acreage in these six sections.
