Recently I was requested by the Cameron Lumb**REFERRED TO MAP** a survey of some of their lands in Block 66 TSP 9 T&P RY Co. which were divided by the GH&SA RY, in Culberson County Texas. The results of the survey are given in the following report.

I began the survey at the N W corner of Survey 4, Block 65, TSP 10, T&P RY. from which a connection had previously been made to the NE corner of Survey No. 3 . A large flag was placed at the N E 3, and angles were turned with transit. The Variation of the needle at this private angles were turned with transit. The Variation of the needle at this was N 12°08'E, which was the same variation used in a recent survey along the south line of Block 65 and North line of Block 5 H&TC RY. A tie was run West and North to the N E corner of Survey 1, Blk. 66, TSP 9, T&P RY., crossing Blocks 64, and 77 Public School Land. I had in my possession a Working Sketch from the General Land Office, dated Nov. 14, 1935, for that part of Culberson County covered by Surveys in Blk. 65 TSP 10, T&P Ry.. Public School Block 64, and 77, and T&P Ry Co. Blk 66 TSP 9. and other surveys to the south which were not involved in this survey. for division purposes

This Working Sketch showed that the connection as run should have given a Westing of 3797.4 and a Northing of 15991 varas. My tie between these two points (N W 4 Blk. 65 to N E 1 Blk 66) gave a Westing of 4050.4 varas and a Northing of 15983.4 varas . In veiw of the apparent descrepency a close examination of the records of the County Surveyors Office of Culberson County was made to determine if field notes of a survey of any of the blocks bearing a date later than 1935 wxxx were recorded. None were found. A close field check for corners in Block 66 were was made along t the East line of the block , but none were found which could be identified. A careful search was made in the vicinity of the N E corner of Survey 48 Block 66 and S W corner of Survey 15 Block 77, at which point A.H.Parker claims to have identified the XXM N E 48 when he surveyed Block 77 in 1900. We establiched a rock mound at the S W 15 , and N E 48, on the

We established a rock mound at the S W 15 , and N E 48, on the line south from N E 1 Block 66.

From this point we ran East and establighed a point ax 1141 varas from this point we ran 636 varas south and made a search for the S W corner of Survey 42 Block 64 Public School Lands, nothing was found so we ran east 253 varas and found a rock mound marked S W 42, to be

East 2 varas and North 1.5 varas. From this rock mound we ran East and South to the N W 4 Block 65 and found that the actual Easting was 2654.9 varas (call Distance 2656.4 varas) The Northing was actual distance 1102.9 varas (call and South to the N W 4 Block 65, distance 1109 varas). Considering this as sufficient corroboration of the

position of the Block Lines . we proceeded to survey the GH&SA RY through Survey 15, Block 77, and Surveys 26,27,28,29, 32, 35, and 36 in Block 66 TSP 9 T&P RY CO., and field notes for the divisions of surveys are

submitted herewith. It will be noted that the Westing of Block 77 is increased, as being controlled on the East by the Rock Mound at S W 42, and on the West by a line South from the N E 1 Blk. 66.

As a number of these surveys have been previously patented on the Original Field Notes , the increased width of Block 77 will likely cause some confusion.

This report is herewith submitted for your consideration, and instructions regarding my construction of the blocks if in error.
