Dear Sir:

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Under your order of December 11, 1951, in the case of E.W.Harris, Tsustee et al vs Luther Lee et al, I have sur-Labores 11,14,23 and 26, League No. 281 of the Hutchinson County, out of conflict with Block M, and have the follow-

ing to report to your Court: I found that these labores had been surveyed and marked by Surveyor Sylvan Sanders. Fences supposed to have been erected by Mr. Lee have been removed since I began this survey.

This survey. From my connection with the accepted original N.W. corner of League No. 284, known as the "Anderson Wells Cor-ner", using the course used by State Surveyor about 50 years ago, to determine the extent and boundaries of the unsurveyed Public School Land, particularly Block A 19 in Gaines and Andrews Counties and Block A 30, in the eastern part of Gaines County, as indicated by some of his corners, still in existence, I found the southeast corner of Labor No 26, which is the southeast cornerof League No. 261, to be about 4 yaras from the olde set by Sanders.

4 varas from the pipe set by Sanders. The Sanders corners along the west line of these labores, are nearly parallel and avreaging about 20 feet east of old fences, apparently built to enclose the labores on the west side of these labores.

Since the Sanders corners are so close to the con-nection I have made, and fitting older holdings so well, I have adopted the Sanders survey and my report gives des-cription of these labores, 11, 14, 23 and 26, League No. 281 as marked by Sanders rather than attempt a very small adjustment, since such differences can reasonable be expected to accumulate in making so long a survey over the territory involved.
