of J G Callahans League west 150 varas

From the N.E. corner of J Morris  $\frac{1}{3}$  of a League standing  
on the <sup>East</sup> Southern line of J T Finleys League N 40° E 1100  
varas to the most East or S.E. corner of J T Finleys League  
thence running S 65° E 650 then running S 50° E 1170 varas to  
the County line between Gonzales and Victoria =

From the S.E. corner of  $\frac{1}{4}$  League granted to Capt B  
Lockhart situated on the Grandaloup river running East  
1250 varas thence running South 960 varas to the  
County line between Gonzales and Victoria County  
thence <sup>with the County line</sup> ~~N 51° 20' E~~ 3640 varas to the Grandaloup  
river or

From J G Callahans South corner with the S.E. line of Survey  
N 46 mddles  $\frac{1}{2}$  to 2093 varas to the North corner of  
H G Woods Survey of  $\frac{1}{3}$  of a League

I do not find any record of A Carethers Survey in this office  
the following is a copy of a letter filed in this office by  
J York addressed to him in reference to Carethers  
Survey by C Lockhart dated Gonzales August the  
12<sup>th</sup> 1838, I examined the returns of May Warren  
and find the two where he had Surveyor for A Carethers  
which surveys were not prepared for the General Land  
Office they will not appear on my County plat  
which I will send to the Commissioner General of the  
General Land Office in few days Mr Warren did  
not dare to put them on his corrected plat which  
he furnished me I will write again next month

I hearthers Survey I suppose from the foregoing  
letter that the Survey were considered by Mr  
Lockhart as illegal.

There is some connection on the Salado that  
I will not be able to send as the surveys are  
not correct and can only be corrected in the field  
which I will attend to as soon as possible

The foregoing connections of the work on the  
Coletto waters <sup>are</sup> correct and as full as I am  
able to give them unless I be required to  
copy all of the field notes which I suppose  
are in the Genl Land office (at least I should

Gonzales March 11<sup>th</sup> 1845

Respected Sir

I received a communication by last  
mail from you which some what surprised me as it  
called for information that I supposed were in the  
General Land office but I suppose something has prevented  
it ~~that~~ <sup>is</sup> here with you will find a connection  
that you require I am in hopes to your satisfaction  
at least as far as I am able now to give them in  
the south west part of this country. I cannot give  
the connection on Laredo as Mr. Hector wished as  
the course and distance of the lines are left out in  
the surveys or as they are recorded, and the field  
notes are not in the office, I will try and have  
them arranged as soon as I can, I am at a loss  
to know what acts of mine (if you refer to me) has  
caused unjust and undeserved censure to be cast against  
you, as it has been far from me to act in any way  
to prejudice your name in any manner whatever,  
and am very much in hopes that none of my acts  
tend to prejudice the interest of any individual  
but so far as they deserve censure or merit that ~~it~~ may  
be contributed to me alone,
