 DIMMIT & LA SALLE COUNTIES

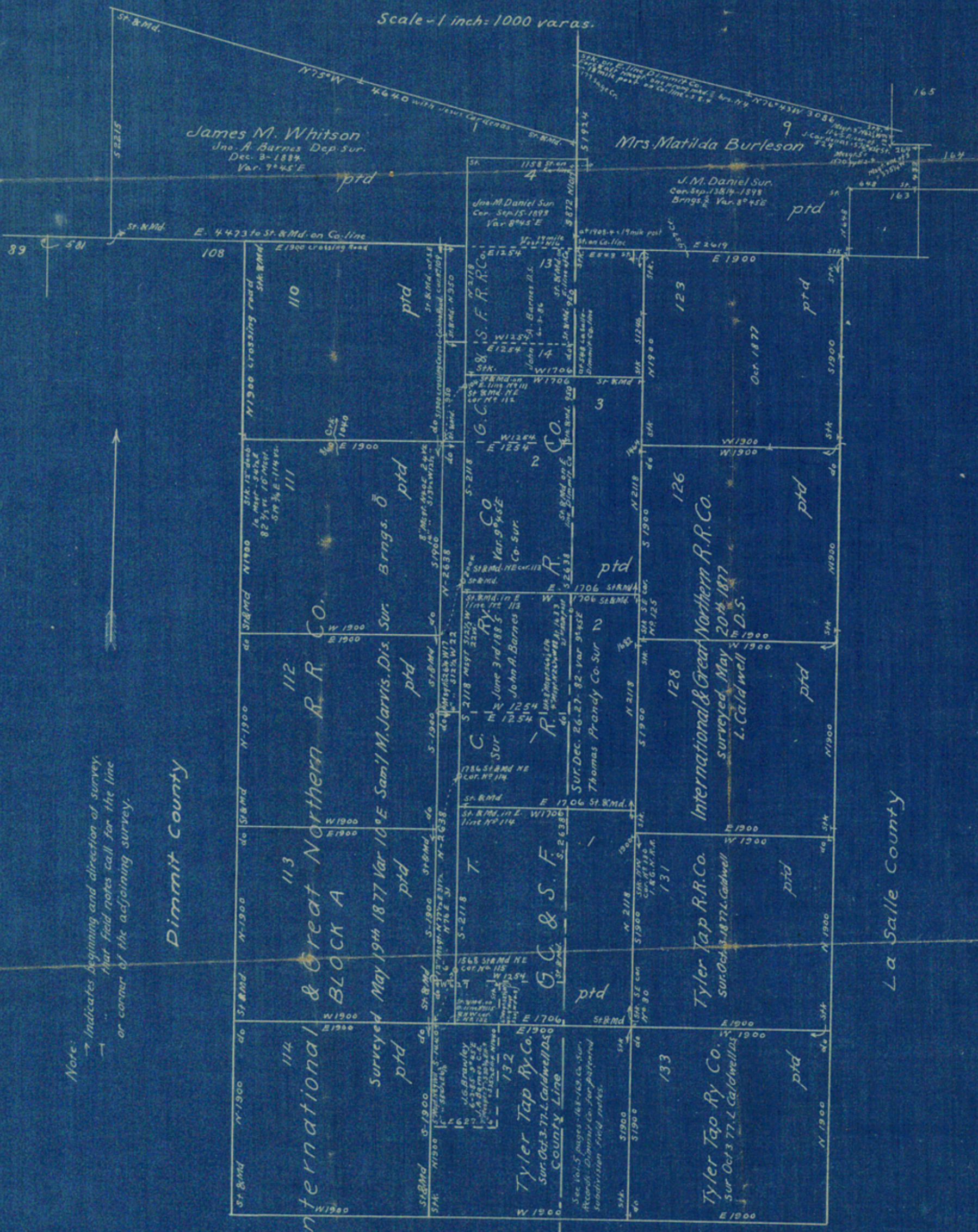

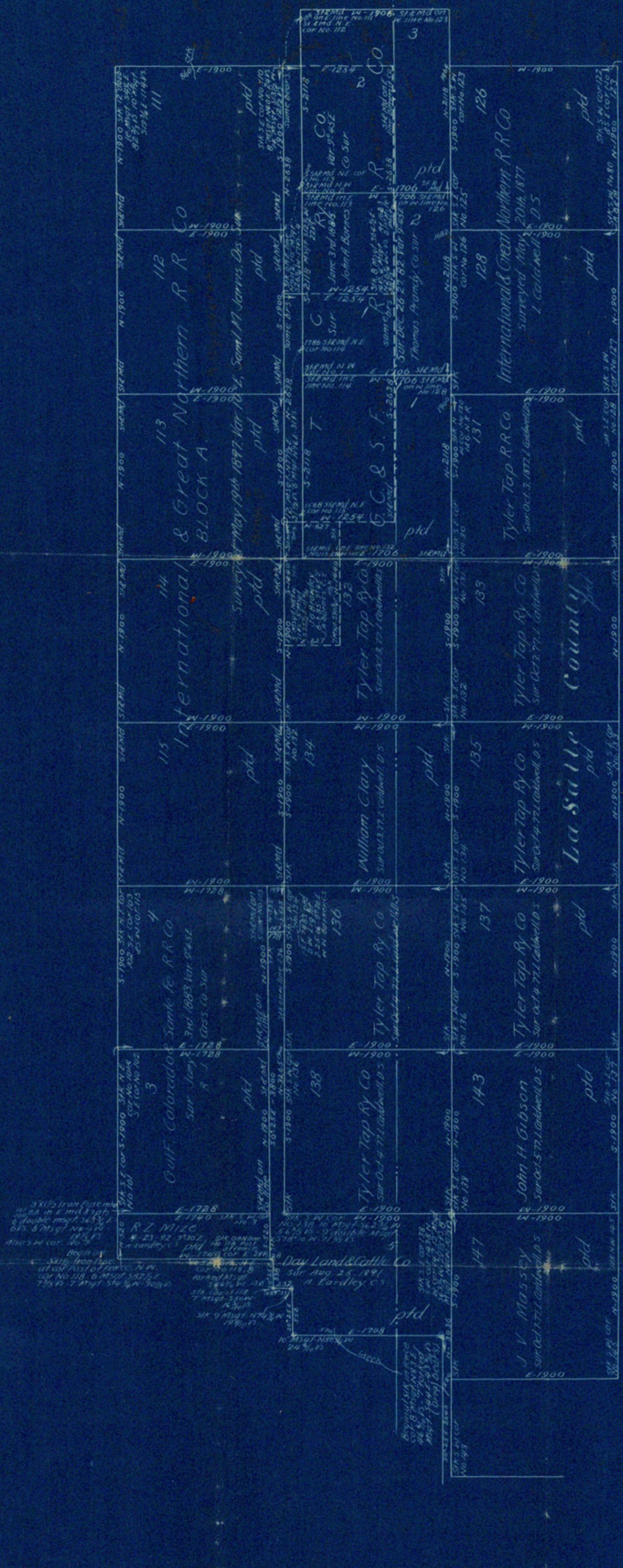
