Dear Sir:

In checking the field notes of Surveys 96, 98, 14, 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 81, in Edwards County, and connecting line accompanying said field notes, received the 11th instant, we note several discrepancies and would like to have more information in regard to your work. We note the size of bearing trees you claim to find to be the same size the original trees were in 1879 and 1888. In the original field notes of Survey 94 the south corner calls for a L O 10 inches N 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 40 varas. Your bearing tree is A L O 10 inches N 59 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 48 varas. Original field notes of Survey 89 at its N corner call for a L O 15 inches N 45 E 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ and a L O 9 inches S 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 39. In your connection you find a L O North 46 E 100 and another L O South 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 43; the line tree between Survey 89 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 89 is a L O 14 inches N 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 101 varas, make this distance 110 varas.

We don't understand why the North boundary lines of Surveys 93, 94, 95 and 96 are not parallel to the South boundary lines of said surveys. Your sketch shows quite a difference if the distances you note on same are correct.

Please explain all your work that differs from the original work.

We are returning you your check but will hold the field notes until we receive further information in regard to your work.
