In pursuance of an order made at the January Term (A.D. 1860) of said Court directing the Surveyor of Falls County John H. Pierson and the undersigned Surveyor of McLennan County to survey and define the interior boundary of the Geo. W. Morgan League of land situated in Falls County on the East side of the Brazos River.

The following is respectfully submitted by the undersigned as a Report of the result of surveys & examinations carefully made in obedience to said Order to wit, Upon due notice given to the parties interested in said Survey they met and by an agreement induced upon the said Order waived a special survey of the said Morgan League, agreeing that the order of survey might be executed by ascertaining if there be any conflict & if any how much between the Ignacia Bosques Eleven League Grant & the Geo. W. Morgan League grant - admitting that the George W. Morgan League is as set forth in the fieldnotes & represented on the maps now in use in the Genl. Land Office. After a survey of the Marcelino Martinez League and establishing the same beyond any reasonable doubt - by running the lines above or the upper and the lower boundary of the said League, the former falling short of calls 2 &c and the latter 145 &c - the lines were found to be well defined and marked, except that portion lying between S.W. cor & where said line crosses the river, or not found to have cut enough, with what appeared to be a heavy Hack knife or some other wide bitted instrument. It was ascertained by boring out one of the hacks on the south boundary line that the age corresponded with the date of the Survey as reported in W. Moores work to wit, 27 years - The back line of this League was not found to be marked which being run N. 28 W at 2222 &c intersected the upper or North line 56 $\frac{1}{2}$ & 86 $\frac{1}{2}$ W of cor as shown by W^r Pierson - the stumps of bearing trees an Elm & Mesquite answering in size course & distance

for N.E. corner - at the S.W. corner a cottonwood some 24 in dia lrs \$88 E
 5.6 vs. from Stake a Willow 11 in dia is found N:45 W. 3.6 vs. - the Willow
 is down & partially decayed a depression in the ground remains very
 distinct where it stood - The S.E. corner has both bearing trees stand-
 ing to wit 2 post oak trees 12 & 15 in - now 15 & 20 in - the former bears
 N:8 1/2 E 578 vs & the latter lrs N:15 E 66 vs. from a stake at corner The
 lower line crosses a creek at 10.310 vs running out N:62 E from S.W.
 cor on the River in Bear Bend agreeably to the calls in the upper line
 of the Bosquez 7 League Survey. said Creek is crossed at 10.400 vs
 having a discrepancy of 90 vs. The River has washed in the East bank
 at S.W. cor from 50 to 100 vs which will account for the discrepancy - This
 survey appearing to the undersigned as well established. the investigation
 of the Bosquez 7 League Survey was continued upon its North boundary
 line from the S.E. cor of the Martinez which was made upon the
 said north line - at 15,108 vs. from S.W. cor or S.W. cor of Martinez cros-
 ses another creek - which as per calls in Bosquez upper line was
 crossed at 15,190 vs. showing a discrepancy between calls and our mea-
 sure to be only 82 vs - which will in part be amounted for by the washing
 in of the East Bank of the River. This line is found to be plainly marked
 2600 vs N:62 E from S.E. cor of Martinez or 15,073 vs from the River at which
 distance enter a prairie of several thousand vs before striking timber on
 the course - from a point 18,018 vs N:62 E from River on said line. another
 line was run S:28 E & at 18,509 vs intersected the upper line of the S.
 Chambers 8 League Survey as made by W. Moore - the width as per
 calls in Moores notes embracing the Manchaca 4 & the Bosquez 7
 Leagues survey should be 13,750 vs. showing a deficit by our measure
 of 241 vs. The Chambers said upper line was run into the river
 at S:62 W. & found to be well marked & corresponding in character & age
 of marks with the lines hitherto tested - The upper line of the Chambers
 being the lower line of the Manchaca 4 League Survey. and assuming that
 the lower line of the charting is the upper line of the Bosquez 7 League
 Survey it will be seen that the relative position of said lines will
 agree with their leaving of & closing on the River as laid down from

Moores Meanders showing a discrepancy of less than $100 \frac{1}{2}$ - and allowing a line to run out from a point on the River 5000 vs on a right line above the Chambers upper or Manchaca lower line. It will be found that the legs of the Manchaca will fit on the River within less than $200 \frac{1}{2}$ and that those of the Bosques will be found to agree with each other within 400 vs and by inspection upon the accompanying Maps carefully made out - from work done upon the Ground and from the Fieldnotes of Surveys & Meanders of the River - it will be seen from the dotted lines dividing the River on its Meanders - which line in each survey represented on said map or diagram is 20.000 vs from the back lines of each survey respectively - being the lengths required in all 11 League Surveys when there is no departure from right lines at the end Leagues require only 10.000 vs under like circumstances - that the land taken in & thrown out very nearly balances in every survey as made by Moore showing that the proper Area in each survey can be had only upon like Meanders or general bearing of the River on their respective fronts - from the almost perfect balancing of the Meanders as above shown & the particularity manifest in the surveys as made by Moore - The undersigned is led fully to believe that the surveyor made an exact estimate of land comprised within the Meanders & a right line measuring the width of the survey by latitude & departure and computed the lengths of lines necessary to make the surveys to contain the exact area by computation upon no other hypotheses can the Significancy of fractions of varas as reported on several of the lines be allowed. It will be necessary here to state that no bearing trees have been discovered as mentioned in the notes for N.W. or of Chambers 8 League & S.W. of Manchaca 4 League nor of the Bosques 7 League Surveys - nor has there been a marked line discovered as dividing the Manchaca & Bosques Surveys - out from the remarkable agreement & harmony found exist between the several surveys - and their almost perfect agreement with the River as laid down from Moores notes, the undersigned is of opinion that the Surveys as represented on the accompanying plot including all above the Chambers have their relative and respective positions correctly as-

signed them.—

But upon the representation of Mr. Pierson that discoveries had been made that the Manchaca 4+ the Bosques 7 Leagues Survey had a different location to that as recognised upon the maps in use in the Land Office. — The undersigned accompanied by Mr. Pierson— proceeded to examine said reputed discoveries. — From a point on the East bank of the Brazos 1260 vs. in a right line above the lower or south boundary line of the said Chambers 8 League Survey — a line was found running out from the River bearing N. 62 E. plainly & well marked of age & character of marks similar to those of the 11 League Survey. crossed what is known as old River Slough or creek at 550 vs. — at 9290 vs. crossed a creek called Sandy — brs. S 27 E. — at 9550 vs. a corner. an Elm & Hackberry the former about 18 in. dia & brs S 38 E. 7 vs. — the latter 10 in. dia brs. S 75 W. 1 3/4 vs. from this point a line sets off S 28 E. an Elm marked — a Hackberry & another Elm marked on line some 30 vs. distant continued the course S 28 E. some 200 vs & entered a wood prairie — found no additional marks — We continued the line N. 62 E. from said corner in running some 900 vs. thro' timber — no further marks being discovered it was deemed unnecessary to pursue the course any further. Mr. Pierson stating that he had continued the course as far as timber extended without finding any additional marks — a line was run S 28 E. ~~4606~~ 4606 vs. from said line to a point near the River where a Hackberry tree some 20 in. dia hacked as a live tree of age & character of hawks corresponding apparently with the lines above stated this was claimed by Mr. Pierson to be the lower line of the Manchaca 4 League Survey Run thence N. 62 E. & at 7400 vs. finding no further or additional marks — suspended work but upon information that a line was known to be in the vicinity which might be found to be a continuation of said line — an examination of said reported line was made — which resulted in finding two trees 177 vs south or below the point at which we suspended work — the one tree a box Elder some 20 in dia pruned

to be marked only some 8 or 9 years ago - the other an ash was marked with hatched t of age corresponding with the surveys made by Moore - 27 years - Moved down to line tree & continued the course N 62 E. & at 7550 vs crossed Isaac's or Big Creek - at 9760 vs passing thro' timber to edge of the prairie 175 vs below the Reputed upper Reserve line which is well marked & with hacks similar to those already described - but frequently with 4 instead of 3 hacks with blazes on fore & oft has the line bds N. 71 E from the point of beginning on the River - there found no additional marks on the line claimed by Pierson as the lower boundary of the Manchaca - the upper line of which as claimed by him is that above described as terminating at 9550 vs at a corner - the upper line of the Basquez as claimed by Pierson is the upper line of the Chambers 8 League Survey - or the upper line of the la Sorda - giving a breadth of Territory for the Basques & Manchaca together of 12,700 vs being 1050 vs short of the breadth as per calls - while the Territory comprised between the upper line of the Chambers & lower line of the Martinez falls short but 241 vs allowing the Manchaca 4 & the Basques 7 Leagues their respective width 5000 & 8750 vs respectively of Leagues their respective width

Thus closes the investigation of the Survey, a Diagram of which marked A. is herewith presented. the dotted lines across the tracts, at 20.000 vs from the back lines as per calls will show on the Manchaca as claimed by Pierson to fall short of the area of 4 Leagues by at least 600 acres & that the lower or closing line of the same will cross over the River over 1300 vs and its width being only 4.606 vs the actual deficit cannot be less than 1000 acres - and as regards the 7 League Survey as claimed by Pierson as the Basques it will be seen from inspection an said Map or Diagram marked A. that the south or closing line will pass over on the west side of the River 2700 vs - More than One & half Miles

It is proper to remark that the River as laid down upon the

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accompanying plot or diagram was made from notes said to have the work of W Moore at the time or about the time the Surveys were made by him - The position of Old River & Cottonwood Slough is believed to be correctly represented from Meanders of the same taken by Mr. Pierson From the surveys actually made and comparing the same with the surveys as recorded upon the maps now in use in the Genl Land Office or more correctly, as laid down on the accompanying Diagram with its Meanders of the River - The undersigned fully convinced and assured that the Basques' Leagues Survey is properly represented on said Diagram or Map and upon the maps now in use in the Genl Land Office and therefore - a Conflict with the Basques' Leagues & George W Morgan League must necessarily exist to the extent of said Morgan League.
