

The State of Texas 3 To the Com. Genl.  
Tall County 3 Lt. Office  
Sir

I have the honor  
to present you with the  
field work done by me at different  
intervals. I commenced the work March  
1<sup>st</sup> A.D. 1873. At the S. W. corner of  
J. Montgomery survey, at this point I  
find an Elm tree as called for in the  
Field Notes of said Montgomery survey  
Hence ran a line N 60° E (crossing  
Pond or Dove Creek immediately)  
1000 ft. to the S. E. corner of Montgomery  
Thence continued this line N 60° E  
at 1276 ft. crossed a branch at 1776 ft.  
set a stake in the prairie for the S. E.  
corner of W. A. Crenshaw. Hence N 30  
W at 908 ft. crossed a branch 1100  
ft. set a stake for the N E corner  
of Crenshaw. but found none of the  
corner trees called for by the field  
notes. Hence ran a line S. 60 W  
I found the N. W. corner of Montgomery  
Survey as called for in field notes  
Aug. 5<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1873.

I commenced work at the point where  
I suppose to be the S. E. corner of  
Crenshaw. Hence N 60° E 1243 ft.

set a stake for the N.C. corner of Lewis Biocamp at this point I did not find the trees called for in the Biocamp survey. Thence S 30 E at 740  $\frac{1}{2}$  vas a branch 2230 vas a Post Oak tree marked 9 bears S 76 W 150 vas Thence S 60 W 5-32 vas in prairie. Thence S. 30 E at 680 vas I find one of the bearing trees of the John Barry survey an Elm bears S. 3 W 12 vas marked U.

From this point I go back to the S. C. corner of S. 1 Biocamp ran a line N 60° E 15-18 vas here I examine for the bearing trees of the A. J. Miles survey but find none that I could claim for corner trees continued N 60° E at 80 vas crossed a small branch in prairie at 500 vas I find a Live Oak marked L and an Elm stump almost decayed that I take to be the N W corner of J. J. Shields at 720  $\frac{1}{2}$  vas crossed Live Oak Creek at 15-5-8 here are some Mesquite timber but none that I could call bearing trees of Houston Greenwood survey. Then I continue this line N 60° E 326 vas here I find

a Musquit stump corresponding  
with that called for in the  
notes of the J. T. Shields survey  
from this point - I go back to  
where I suppose to be the S.C.  
Corner of T. C. Greenwood ran  
a line  $N 30^{\circ} W$  1030 rods  
here I find the trees called for  
in the Cattin field notes.

Then I go to the N.C. corner  
of Coleman survey thence S 60  
W. with the line of Coleman  
and Miles surveys I found  
this line did not close by  
100. or 150 rods which I will  
clearly show by the accompa-  
-ing plat.
