Dr Sir.

Your circular directing
my attention to an Act entitled "An Act sup-
plementary to &c" has been duly recd.

With regard to the condition of the Office
I have to say first that it is without any
map at all. We have in the office an old
and inaccurate map, but it is the private
property of the last incumbent and may be
taken away at any time. The regulations
require I believe that we shall keep in the
office a well bound book for entries of files. The
book used for that purpose is of a very common
kind and contains only a record of the
files made during the term of the last Sur-
veyor. I would like to have a record of the files
for a greater length of time back and the

same neatly copied in a "well bound book" as the regulations require, but do not know how ~~the~~ ^{it} same is to be provided. The record of surveys in the county, though somewhat defalcated, incomplete, and badly indexed is still serviceable.

Please inform me how these repairs are to be made, and if there is a compendious collection of the statutes or regulations referring to my office I send me a copy of the same.
