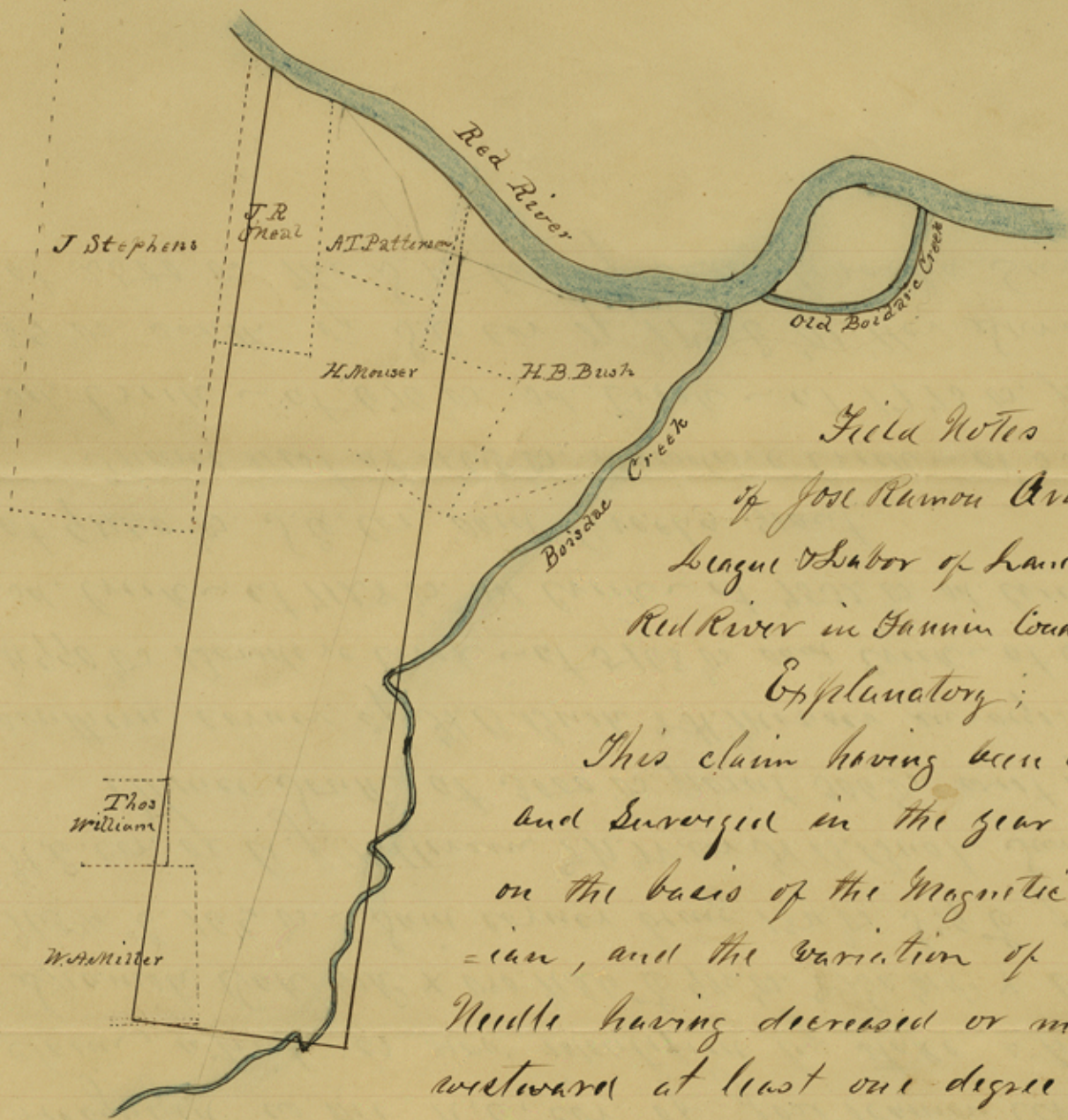

 Exploratory;

This claim having been located and surveyed in the year 1835 on the basis of the Magnetic Meridian, and the variation of the Needle having decreased or moved westward at least one degree since that date, the present survey is made with variation of Needle of $N 1^{\circ} W$; and all connections are made on same basis. Also, surveys made in the vicinity have generally been made with variation of $N 7^{\circ} E$;—therefore the lines of this and adjacent surveys diverge 8° .

Preliminary Survey.

Beginning at stake near old mouth of Boisjane Creek, on east bank and south bank of Red River;—being the supposed N.E. cor. of the R Bedford grant.

Thence up Red River with meanders, (By)
 $N 78^{\circ} W$ at 30 $vs.$ center of old mouth of Boisjane—
 at 618 $vs.$ point on bank of Red River, $S 80^{\circ} W$ 427 $vs.$
 — $S 67^{\circ} W$ 197 $vs.$ — $S 33^{\circ} W$ 172 $vs.$ — $S 20^{\circ} W$ 113 $vs.$ — South
 214 $vs.$ — $S 12^{\circ} W$ 231 $vs.$ — $S 42^{\circ} W$ at 546 $vs.$ old bed of

Boisdare Creek - at 612⁰⁰ vs. point on bank Red River. -
 S 56⁰⁰ W 407⁰⁰ vs. present, mouth of Boisdare Creek. - West

 grant. This bluff is said by old citizens to have
 over-hung the bed of Red River thirty five years ago;
 but the channel of the river has receded, and now
 runs about 600⁰⁰ vs. to the northward of this point.
 Diligent search was here made for the witness trees
 called for, but could find nothing except the trunks
 and remains of several old Cotton Wood trees, too much
 decayed to discover any land-marks: - But from data
 furnished from Genl. Land Office, this point is
 recognized as the N.E. cor. of Jose Ramon Crocha
 claim, which is now identified by stake whence
 Spanish Oak Mk. x bro N 26⁰⁰ E 9 1/2⁰⁰ vs. & Do. Mk. x bro.
 N 5 1/4⁰⁰ E. 16 3/4⁰⁰ vs. - Said corner being 184⁰⁰ vs. S 79⁰⁰ E from
 N.E. cor. of A. J. Patterson & N.W. cor. H. B. Bush Survey.

Thence South at 3000⁰⁰ vs. point 306⁰⁰ vs. west of most
 southern corner of H. B. Bush & H. Mouser surveys. - at
 4990⁰⁰ vs. Boisdare Creek - at 5168⁰⁰ vs. said Creek - at 6970⁰⁰ vs.

S68 E 3³/₄ br. This corner being established as N.W.
cor. of said Arocha claim, being 265 br. S80 E from
N.W. cor. of J.R. O'Neal & N.E. cor. Geo Stephens Surveys.

Thence down said River with meanders, (viz)
S60 E. 370 br. & S80 E 600 br. & S45 E 1100 br. & S28 E
855 br. & S79 E. 417 br. to beginning or first corner
of said Arocha Claim.
