

Field Notes of Jose Ramon Arrechea Surveyor
of land on Red River in Tarrant County Texas.

Explanatory

This claim having been located and surveyed in the year 1835 on the basis of the Magnetic Meridian, and the variation of the Needle having decreased or moved westward at least one degree since that date, the present survey is made with variation of Needle of $N1^{\circ}W$; and all connections are made on same basis. Also, surveys made in the vicinity have generally been made with variation of $N7^{\circ}E$; - therefore the lines of this and adjacent surveys diverge 8° .

Preliminary Survey -

Beginning at stake near old mouth of Boisidare Creek, on east bank and south bank of Red River - being the supposed N.E. cor. of the R. Bedford grant.

Thence up Red River with meanders $N78^{\circ}W$ at 30 Yo. center of old mouth of Boisidare - at 618 Yo. point on bank of Red River $S80^{\circ}W$ 427 Yo. - $S54^{\circ}W$ 197 Yo. - $S33^{\circ}W$ 172 Yo. - $S20^{\circ}W$ 113 Yo. - South 214 Yo. - $S12^{\circ}W$ 231 Yo. - $S42^{\circ}W$ at 546 Yo. old bed of Boisidare Creek - at 612 Yo. point on bank Red River $S56^{\circ}W$ 407 Yo. Present mouth of Boisidare Creek - West 830 Yo. - $S76^{\circ}W$ 309 Yo. - West 238 Yo. - $N76^{\circ}W$ 309 Yo. - West 297 Yo. - $N76^{\circ}W$ 1246 Yo. Point on bluff of

Red River supposed to be the N.E. cor. of said Arocha grant. This bluff is said by old citizens to have overhung the bed of Red River thirty five years ago; but the channel of the river has receded, and now runs about 600' to the northward of this point. Diligent search was here made for the witness trees called for, but could find nothing except the trunks and remains of several old Cottonwood trees, too much decayed to discover any land marks:- But from data furnished from Gen'l. Land Office, this point is recognized as the N.E. cor. of Jose Ramon Arocha claim, which is now identified by stake where a Spanish Oak M.R. x bro. N 26° 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. & So. M.R. x bro. N 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ E 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ S. - Said corner being 184' W. 849' E. from N.E. cor. of A.J. Patterson & U.W. cor. of H.B. Bush survey.

Thence South at 3,000' point 306' W. west of most southern corner of H.B. Bush & H. Mouser surveys - at 4,990' W. Boisadare Creek - at 5,168' W. said Creek - at 6,970' W. sd. Creek - at 7,128' W. sd. Creek - at 7,532' W. sd. Creek - at 9,440' W. S.E. cor. said Arocha grant.

Thence West at 4,63' W. Boisadare Creek - at 5,35' W. sd. Creek - at 6,76' W. sd. Creek - at 17,73' W. point 89' W. south of S.E. cor. of Mr. E. Miller Sur. - at 2,500' W. the S.W. cor. of said Arocha Sur. - a stake where P.O. M.R. x bro. N 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ E 5' S. & So. M.R. A bro. N 38' 9" S.

Thence North at 1,877' W. point 135' W. west of S.E. cor. of Thos Williams Sur. - at 2,836' W. point 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. west of N.E. cor. of said Thos Williams - at 11,341' W. stake on bank of Red River

whence an Elm M.R. x bro. S 25° W 11' S. & Bur Oak M.R. x bro. S 68° E 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. - This corner being established as N.W. cor. of said Arocha claim, - being 2,65' W. 880' E. from N.W. cor. of J.R. O'Neal & U.C. cor. Jno Stephens Survey.

Thence down said River with meanders (Vg) 860' E. 370' W. - 880' E. 600' W. - 845' E 1100' W. - 828' 855' W. - 879' E. 417' W. to beginning or first corner of said Arocha Claim.
