To the Hon. Jakob Kuechler Comm'r of Gen'l Land Office
Austin Texas.

- 3.) I have a well bound entry book in which all files and locations, made by the Surveyors of Fayette County are recorded, open for every body in my Office — but there are several locations made in my District by Surveyors of the adjoining Counties I would like to have those Surveys, but in which County are they recorded and how can I get them? Can you sent them down, or will it be allowed for me to make charges for my service when I go by myself to the different County seats and get coppie of them locations which I have not got — please answer soon
