Dear sir:

The First National Bank of  
Sterling City thru its cashier, Mr. J. S. Cole,  
handed me your letter of June 26. together  
with three field notes (1) for S 1/2 of sec.  
44, 13EK. 32, Tsp. 5. S., T. V. P. Ry. Co., (2) The  
N 1/2 of sec. 92, 131K. 2, T. V. P. Ry. Co. and  
all in Glasscock Co.  
(3) all of survey No. 4, Cert No 2922, for corrections  
required by <sup>you</sup> as endorsed on back thereof.

I beg to say that I have written in  
the required corrections and made records  
to correspond, and am returning the same  
for your approval

I note that you say you have on file  
evidence that 13EK. 33 N. V. S. lines are excessive.  
The N. V. S. lines of both 13EKs. 32 & 33 are excessive  
by over 200 varas, but as T. H. Seay, - Simpson,  
H. B. Tarver, Claude Beckett and myself have surveyed  
it, this excess does not exist on the S. Tier  
B of surveys. An old stone end. for the N. E. cor.  
Counter 24192

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of sec. 48, 131K 33 <sup>and</sup> N.W. cor. of sec. 43, 131K. 32. has long been recognized <sup>by</sup> the owners of the lands affected as well <sup>as</sup> these surveyors as an original cor. ~~It~~ repeatedly measured in recent years, This line is 1901 vrs. N. 13° W from the S.E. cor. of 131K. 33 which is proven by the position of the stumps of the original bearing trees as well as course <sup>and</sup> distance and the digging up a buried <sup>ind.</sup> of stone which was covered <sup>with earth</sup>.

The E. line of sec. 48, 131K. 32 is 1900 vrs marked by a stone <sup>ind.</sup> and recently patented to Carlos Webb by your agent.

Now, as the W. line of sec. 43 131K 32 is 1900 vrs. <sup>and</sup> the E. line of sec. 48 is 1900 vrs. as recited by patent, I made the E. & W. lines of sec 44 to correspond.

The original field notes of sec 44, 131K 32. calls for the N.E. cor. to be a rock <sup>ind.</sup> and a pile of buffalo bones. This corner is known <sup>to the</sup> ranchmen as the "Buffalo Corner." <sup>The late</sup> Capt. Murray Harris. who surveyed <sup>this</sup> line about 1875 often had me to survey for him. One day the old man was with me on the ground while running the S. lines of secs 43, 44 <sup>and</sup> 45. Before reaching the S.E. cor. of 44, he told me there should be a pile of buffalo bones on a rock mound. When we ran out to it, we found quite a

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few fragments of bones. He told me that he put them there with his own hands. On his testimony, <sup>and</sup> by course <sup>and</sup> distance I recognized this as original corner. That was 20 years ago <sup>and</sup> the old man is dead. Then, as we ran westward, he pointed out the corners I have indicated as original. ~~He had me~~ The bearing trees were then down but their stumps were there <sup>and</sup> we tested these corners by courses <sup>and</sup> distances <sup>and</sup> he led me to believe that they were original when he told me that he placed them there. I have acted accordingly.

As a surveyor, I have been over this ground many times in the last 30 years, <sup>and</sup> I have found no one to doubt but these corners are original.

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These field notes describe lands belonging to a woman. She is in a hurry to patent this land. If you will co-operate with me, we will get this matter straightened out so you can send Mr Cole a statement (over)

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so that patents can issue.

If further requirements of me are to be made, make them direct to me.
