Beginning at a pile of stone on the
E. bank of Las Linguis or N. Pease River
mkd T + P whence a F. Cotton wood tree 3 ft
in dia standing on the W. Bank of river under
a high rock bluff brs S $70\frac{1}{2}$ W & a large 4
pronged cotton wood stump (fallen) brs. S $25\frac{1}{2}$ W.
& a stone md on the E. pt of mt. brs. N $66\frac{1}{2}$ E.
Thence S at 280 vs. pass a large spring at
664 a rock mkd N.W. 8. T + P. at 730 vs a rock
mkd X on one side & N.E. 1. T + P. on the other which
stone is the N.E. cor. of sur. No 1 of Blk 3 T + P
RR Co -

Thence E at 400 vs. Quitagua Peak brs. S.
23 $\frac{7}{8}$ E. at 2400 vs. leaves mesquits & enters
a white flat at 3100 vs. branch course
S 85 E. at 3590 vs a branch course S 48 E. at
5350 vs. pass a round top mt. at 5660 vs a
pile of stone on the road to Quitagua Rancho
br S 100 vs at 13940 vs. pass 243 vs. N of
a pile of stone mkd T + B on a rocky point
whence a china tree 8 in dia on the N.E.
bank of a creek brs N $16\frac{3}{4}$ W. and a sharp
peak on Little Red brs. N $28\frac{7}{8}$ W. at 29828 vs
a pt 528 vs. N of a pile of Buffalo bones
on the prairie whence Quitagua Peak brs S 44 W.

Beginning at the pt 29828 E of the N.E.
cor. sur. No 1 of Blk No 3 for T & P R.R. Co. as
described above - Thence S at 528 vs. pass
a pile of Buffalo bones on the prairie
whence Lintiqua Peak bro. 344 W. at 16313 vs.
pass 285 vs. E of pile of stones on the N bank
of Peace River at 16443 vs. The S.B. line
of Sur. No 97 of Blk No 3 T & P R.R. Co. -
Thence S 6 1/2 E 651 vs. or stake the S.E. cor.
of said Sect. No 97. whence a cith W 18" dia
(fallen) bro. N 60 W. 211 vs. - The meanders
as given in the field notes of Blk 3 being
traced from said stake both up and down
the river for several miles were found to
fit very well, also those on the S. side
especially of survey No 18 in Blk 4 in
its call for the mouth of Creek

S of a Chinaberry Stake 2 high + 4" Square set for the SW. corner of sur. No 20 of Blk 18 for M + G. N. RR Co. whence a chinaberry tree vrs. S 58 1/8 E 943 vrs + another vrs. S 75 E. and at 67 E. from the first - The said stake on S bank of the river is supposed to be the N.W. cor of Sur No 1. of J. Pointevert's surveys of Blk No 1. - It is also N 377 vrs + W. 23 vrs. from a pile of stone on the S side of a red hill supposed to have been placed for the West line of J. Pointevert's -

of sur no 1. of Blk 1 for J. Poutarout) and
the NW cor of sur no 11. of Blk G. 5 is given
in the field notes of the most northern survey
of Blk W for Lem Blum.

Beginning at the NW cor of sur no
11. of Blk G. 5 for D. & S. E. P. A. Co. 2 rods
from which a lone China tree 4" dia on
the S. bank of Red River brs. N 25 W. 86 v.

Thence S 20 59 v. a pt. Thence West
6226 v. to the SW. cor of sur. no 63 of
Blk G. 5 for The E. L. & P. A. Co. Three
Lycium rocks from which a calk W
tree 12" dia brs N. 89 E. 42 v. do 14" dia
brs S 54 E. 75 v.
