Field notes of a connection line
made for Leon Blinn's Survey S. of
Red River in Blk W-

Beginning at a pile of stone on the
E. bank of Las Linguis or N. Peace River
marked T & P whence a T. Cott wood tree 3 ft
in dia standing on the W. Bank of river under
a high rock bluff br. S $70\frac{1}{2}$ W & a large 4
pronged cotton wood stump (fallen) br. S $25\frac{1}{2}$ W.
& a stone and on the E. ph of mt. br. N $66\frac{1}{2}$ E.
Hence S at 280 vs. pass a large spring at
664 a rock mtld N.W. 8. T & P. at 730 was a rock
mtld X on one side & N.E. 1. T & P. on the other which
stone is the n.e. cor. of sur. no 1. of Blk 3 T & P
R R Co.-

Hence E at 400 vs. Quitequa Peak br. S.
23 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. at 2400 vs. leaves mesquits & enters
a white flat at 3100 vs. branch course
S 85 E. at 3590 vs a branch course S 48 E. at
5350 vs. pass a round top mt. at 5660 vs a
pile of stone on the road to Quitequa Ranch
br. S 100 vs. at 13940 vs. pass 243 vs. N of
a pile of stone mtld H + B on a rocky point
whence a chinia tree 8 in dia on the N.E.
bank of a creek br. N $16\frac{1}{4}$ W and a sharp
peak on Little Red br. N $28\frac{1}{2}$ W. at 29828 vs.
at 528 vs. N of a pile of Buffalo bones
on the prairie whence Quitequa Peak br. S 44 W.

R.R. Co. sur. Blk 3.5. Hence S 400 m. on a pt.
the SW cor. of sur. No 28 same Blk - Hence E.
964 m. the N.E. corner of sur. No 28 same
block a pile of cobble stones on a gravel hill
whence another pile of stone on the E. side
of a branch or Gypsum Creek br. E. 380 m.
which pile of rocks is the com. S cor. of Survey
No 28 & 27 of sd Blk 3.5 all of which cor-
ners were found on the ground as described.

Beginning at the pt 29828 E of the N.E.
cor. sur. No 1 of Blk No 3 for T&P R.R. cor. as
described above - Hence S at 528 m. pass
a pile of Buffalo bones on the prairie
whence Quitequa Peak br. 344 W. at 16313 m.
pass 285 m. E of pile of stones on the N bank
of Peace River at 16443 m. the S.B. line
of Sur. No 97 of Blk no 3 T&P R.R. Co.
Hence S 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 651 m. a stake the S.E. cor.
of said Sect. No 97 whence a coll w. 18" dia
(fallen) br. N 60 W. 211 m. The meanders
as given in the field notes of Blk 3 being
traced from said stake back up and down
the river for several miles were found to
fit very well, also those on the S. side
especially of Survey No 18 in Blk 4 in
its course for the mouth of Creek

Beginning again at the pt 29828 m. E.
of the N.E. cor. of sur. No 1 of Blk No 3 for T&P

R.R. 60 as described above - Hence N at
20622 m. a pt on the S. side of Little Red
creek 360 yrs. N + 537.3 m. E of the Com. S.
Cor. of Surv. 15 + 14 made for L. G. Coleman -

Hence E 6207 m. to a pile of gypsum
rock on the N.W. slope of hill whence a
cedar on top of hill br. E. 150 yrs. which
pile of stones is the S.E. corner No 13 for
L. G. Coleman -

Hence N 600 m. a pt on E. B line of
sd surv No 13

Hence E at 600 m. pass the SW. cor. of Surv.
No 12 for L. G. Coleman at 2500 m. the
S.E. cor. of sd. Surv. No 12 a rd on top
of hill -

Hence N at 1900 m. pass the N.E. cor.
of sd Coleman Surv. No 12 at 3254 m. a pt.

Hence E. 148 m. a stake on the S bank of
Prairie Dog Town Fork of Red River which
was found by actual measurement to be
5700 m. W. + 10938 m. S of a Chinaberry Stake
2 high + 4" square set for the SW. corner
of Surv. No 20 of Blk 18 for H & G. N. R.R. Co.
whence a chinaberry tree br. 8 58/8 E 940
m. + another br. 375 E. and at 67 E. from the
first - The said stake on S bank of the river is
supposed to be the N.W. cor. of Surv. No 1. of
J. Pointreault surveys of Blk No 1 - It is also
N 377 m. + W. 23 m. from a pile of stone on
the S side of a red hill supposed to have been
placed for the West line of J. Pointreault -

the NW cor of sur no 11. of Blk G. 5 is given
in the field notes of the much northern survey
of Blk W for Lem Blum.

Beginning at the NW cor of sur no
11. of Blk G. 5 for D & S. E. R. R. Co. 2 rods
from which a lone China tree 4" dia on
the S. bank of Red River br. N 25W 86° 00'.
Hence S 20 59' 00". a pt. Hence West
6226 rods to the SW cor of sur. no 63 of
Blk G. 5 for the E. L. & P. R. Co. three
Gypsum rocks from which a tall W
tree 12" dia br. N. 89E. 42° 00". do 14" dia
br. S 54E. 75° 00".
