Dear Sir,

I shall be able to get to your work in a week or ten days. Have already examined the records and your sketches. I am of the opinion that your lands are seriously in conflict with major surveys. Unless you contest the so-called "Ragsdale survey". However I suppose you wish to know just what you have.

Mr. Cogdell in order to locate your land I'll have to run from the original corners on the south side of the block. I suppose you noticed the calls for them on your sketches. Then I'll have to see the relation of these locations to the south line of Bk. A, A. B. & M. This I calculate will take me about five or six days. I'll have to have two chain carriers and a flagman. And as it is the custom with strangers I'll ask you to forward me \$75.00
