(1) District Attorney's Bond payable to the Governor—to be approved by the District Judge. Bonds of District Clerks, County Clerks, Sheriff, County Attorneys, Constables, Notaries and Surveyors are made payable to the Governor. Bond of County Treasurers, Hide and Animal Inspectors, Justices of the Peace, and Public Weighers are made payable to the County Judge. Bonds of County Judges and County Commissioners are made payable to the County Treasurer. Bonds of County Commissioners as Road Commissioners are made payable to the County Judge. Bonds of Superintendents of Public Instruction are made payable to the County Commissioners' Court in trust for the Public School Fund of the County. Butchers' bonds are payable to the State of Texas.

(2) If District Attorney, bond required is \$5,000. If District Clerk, bond required is \$5,000. If County Judge, bond required is from \$1,000 to \$5,000, to be fixed by the Commissioners' Court. If County Clerk, bond required is from \$2,000 to \$10,000, regulated by the Commissioners' Court. If Notary Public or Justice of the Peace as such, bond required is \$1,000. If Hide and Animal Inspector, bond required is from \$1,000 to \$10,000, regulated by the Commissioners' Court. If Sheriff, bond required is from \$5,000 to \$30,000, regulated by the Commissioners' Court. If County Attorney, bond required is \$2,500. Constable, bond required is \$500 to \$1,500, regulated by the Commissioners' Court. If Surveyor, bond required is not less than \$500 nor more than \$10,000. If County Treasurer, any amount the Commissioners' Court may elect; bond for School Fund required in double amount of the Fund, to be estimated by County Judge. If County Commissioner, bond required is \$3,000. If County Commissioner, as Road Commissioner, bond required is \$1,000. If Justice of the Peace, bond required is \$1,000. If County Superintendent of Public Instruction, bond required is \$5,000. Butcher, bond required not less than \$500 nor more than \$5,000. Public Weigher, bond required is \$2,500 for Justice Precinct, Deputy Weigher \$1,000.

(3) Elected or appointed.

(4) If Precinct Officer, state number of Precinct.

(5) District Attorney, conditioned that he will faithfully pay over, in the manner prescribed by law, all moneys which he may collect, or which may come to his hands for the State or for any County. If District Clerk, conditioned for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office. If County Clerk, conditioned for the safekeeping of the records and the faithful discharge of the duties of his office and that said Clerk will pay over to his county all moneys illegally paid to him out of the County Funds, as voluntary payments or otherwise. If Notary, conditioned for the faithful performance of duty only. If Sheriff, conditioned that he will account for and pay over to the persons authorized by law to receive the same, all fines, forfeitures and penalties that he may collect for the use of the State or any County, and that he will well and truly execute and make due returns of all process and precepts to him lawfully directed, and to pay over all sums of money collected by him by virtue of any such process or precepts, to the persons to whom the same are due, or their lawful attorneys, and that he will pay over to his County all moneys illegally paid to him out of County Funds, as voluntary payments or otherwise. If County Attorney, conditioned that he will faithfully pay over, in the manner prescribed by law, all moneys which he may collect or which may come to his hands for the State or any County. If Constable, conditioned for faithful performance of all the duties required of him by law. If Hide and Animal Inspector, conditioned that he will well and truly perform the duties of his office. If Surveyor, conditioned for faithful performance of duty only. If Treasurer, conditioned that he shall faithfully execute the duties of his office; additional conditions are: shall pay, according to law, all money that shall come into his hands as County Treasurer and render a just and true account thereof to said Court at each regular term; School Fund bond conditioned that he will safely keep and faithfully disburse the School Fund according to law, and pay such warrants as may be drawn on said fund by competent authority. If Justice of the Peace, conditioned that he will faithfully and impartially discharge and perform the duties required of him by law, and that he will promptly pay over, to the party entitled to receive it, all moneys that may come into his hands during his term of office. If County Judge, conditioned that he will pay over to the person or officer entitled to receive it, all moneys that may come into his hands as County Judge, within thirty days after he shall have received the same. If County Commissioner, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of his office only; and as Road Commissioner that he will perform all the duties required of him by law. If County Superintendent of Public Instruction, conditioned that he will faithfully perform the duties of his office. If Butcher, conditioned that he will keep a true and faithful record, in a book to be kept for that purpose, of all cattle purchased or slaughtered by him, with a description of the animal, including marks, brands, age, weight and from whom purchased and date thereof, etc. (See Art. 6908.) If Public Weigher, conditioned for the faithful performance of his official duties.

NOTE.—In regard to the approval of officers' bonds: Constables, County Attorneys, County Clerks, County Judges, District Judges, Hide and Animal Inspectors, Sheriffs, County Superintendents, County Surveyors, County Treasurers, Justices of the Peace and Public Weighers are approved by the Commissioners' Court. The bonds of Butchers, County Commissioners and County Commissioners as Road Commissioners, are approved by the County Judge.

The bond of the District Attorney is approved by the District Judge; bonds of Notaries Public are approved by the County Clerk.

In regard to the number of sureties required: The bond of Constable, County Attorney, County Clerk, County Commissioner, County Commissioner as Road Commissioner, County Judge, District and County Attorney, District Clerk, Hide and Animal Inspectors, Notaries and Justices of the Peace as such, Sheriffs, County Surveyor and County Treasurer shall have at least two sureties.
