Bonds of District Clerks, County Clerks, Sheriff, County Attorneys, Constables, Notaries and Surveyors are made payable to the Governor. Bond of County Treasurers, Hide and Animal Inspectors, Justices of the Peace, and Public Weighers are made payable to the County Judge. Bonds of County Judges and County Commissioners are made payable to the County Treasurer. Bonds of County Commissioners as Road Commissioners are made payable to the County Judge. Bonds of Superintendents of Public Instruction are made payable to the County Commissioners' Court in trust for the Public School Fund of the County. Butchers' bonds are payable to the State of Texas.


